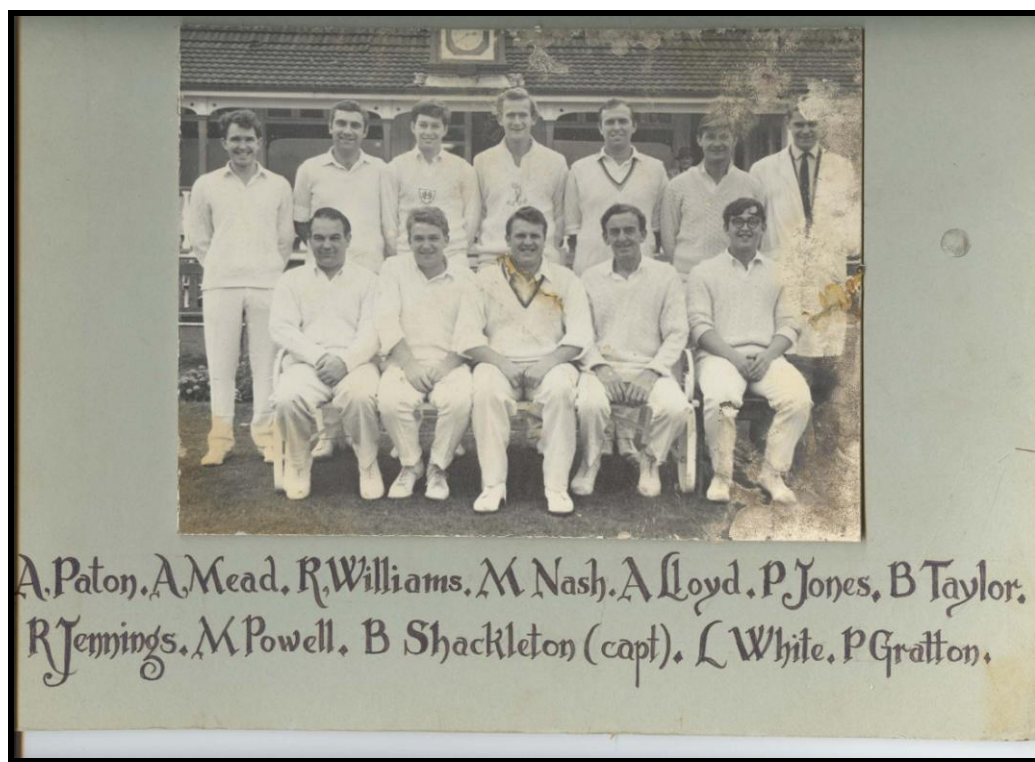


Chapter 23 1968 Season

A sparkling innings of 80 not out from Glamorgan all-rounder Malcolm Nash was the highlight of Abergavenny's opening fixture of the season against Mumbles at Avenue Road. Abergavenny declared at 172-4. Openers Mike Powell (28) and Brian Shackleton (45) had ensured a good platform for Nash. In reply the visitors struggled to 54-6 but held on at 131-6. Nash taking 3 wickets. The next day against Cardiff Choristers Abergavenny struggled themselves to 111 all out, but thanks to Nash 2-22 and Farr 4-26 the Choristers were skittled out for 51.

The following fixture against Panteg was rained off. They did make a start the next day against Newport Fugitives reaching 101-1 with Mike Powell (31*) and Malcolm Nash (61*) before the rain came.

Two home games followed. Chepstow 121-7 M.Farr taking 6-23 and Mel Pritchard 2-31. Abergavenny 122-4. Ken Williams(34) L.White (36) A.Paton (24*) this was followed by Thornbury. Abergavenny 154-6 declared. M.Powell, Brian Shackleton, M.Nash, L.White, K.Williams, J.Powell and P.Greaves all reaching double figures. Thornbury were all out for 101 with M.Nash 3-23, M.Farr 4-36 and D.Griffin 1-7.

The 2nd X1 had their opening match at Chepstow. Abergavenny 2nd's making 103 all out. Brian Taylor (46*) Chepstow 2nd's 45 all out. Greaves 2-1, N.White 3-10, R.Williams 2-12, M.Bennett 1-14.

M.Farr who took over 100 wickets last season has continued in the same vein already this season. Taking 20 wickets in the 4 matches played. Abergavenny 92 all out with only K.Williams, A. Paton and P. Greaves scoring any runs. Dowlais were shattered by Mike Farr who took 7-18 as they were all out for 42. A.Lloyd taking 3- 11.

Heavy rain over the next weekend washed out much of the play for both the 1st and 2nd X1. Abergavenny at Thornbury were 78 for 2 when rain came. The 2nd X1 against Cheltenham Civil Service were 77-6 when it rained in reply to Cheltenham's 144-2 declared.

Another blank weekend followed. However they did manage to beat village side LLanarth in the Monmouthshire Knock out. Abergavenny 79-7 Brian Shackleton and Mike Powell put on 31 for the 1st wicket. LLanarth 65 all out. Mel Pritchard 3-10, A.Paton 2-13.

Abergavenny brought off their finest victory of the season on Whit Monday when they hammered the powerful Lydney side by 5 wickets. The victory was inspired by Mike Powell (Pictured below) who made a brilliant (62) with nine boundaries. Lydney 138-5 declared, A.Lloyd 2-29. Abergavenny 141-5. A.Paton (21*) and Lew White (23*) were there at the close.



Abergavenny 127 all out. M.Powell (28) B.Shackleton (37), John Powell (22) Abertillery 124-7, nearly pulled off victory. M.Farr 3-45, Lloyd, Jennings and M.Powell 1 wicket each. Rain prevented play until 6.20 pm.

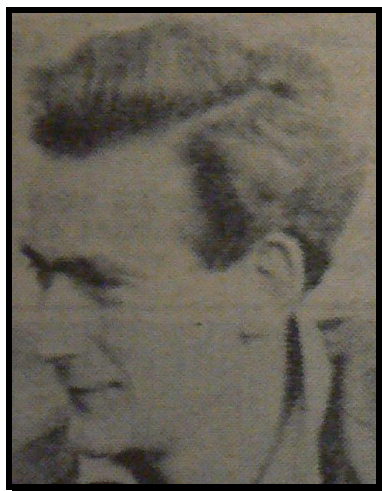

Abergavenny then drew with Panteg who made 158-2 David Parry-Jones (88*) Abergavenny 104-6 M.Powell (34) Brian Shackleton (14)

Abergavenny 92 all out. M.Powell (14) Brian Shackleton (26) R.Williams (16) and Ken Williams (12) Newbridge 96-8. M.Farr 5-31, R. Williams 2-38 and A.Lloyd 1-19

Two last wicket stands robbed Abergavenny of victory against both Cheltenham Civil Service and Lydney. Abergavenny 120 -9 declared with most batsmen 'chipping in'. Cheltenham CS 61-9. Farr 6-21 and Jennings 3-31. Abergavenny 121 all out. M.Powell (58) Ken Williams (15) Lydney 99-9 R.Williams 5-44 and M. Nash 4-37.

Crickhowell 48 all out were at one time 17-7. A.Lloyd 5-18 and M.Farr 5-22. Abergavenny winning by 7 wickets with Mike Powell (31)

Abergavenny then defeated Carmarthen Wanderers but drew with Hornsey and Gowerton. The Gowerton game being marred by rainfall.

Abergavenny 143-8 declared M.Powell (55) Brian Shackleton (23) P.Grattan (37) Hornsey 97-9 M.Farr 5-37, A.Lloyd 2-11, D.Griffin 2-19. Carmarthen 67 all out Bob Jennings 5-6, M.Farr 3-28, D.Ellaway 2-23. Abergavenny 127-8 declared M.Powell (25) J.Powell (15) L.White (17) Gowerton 21-3 when it rained. Mike Farr had bowled 7 overs 6 maidens 2 wickets for 1 run. Eddie Bevan making (4) before being bowled by Robin Williams.

Usk 151-6 declared M.Farr 3-64, D.Ellaway 2-26 and A.Lloyd 1-27. Abergavenny 113-8 M.Powell (55) Brian Shackleton (21)

Abergavenny 111-8 declared Brian Shackleton (25) M.Powell (18), L.White (20) and A.Paton (19) Neath Sphinx 103-8 M.Farr 5-48 taking his season tally to 68 wickets.
