1994 saw some new faces at the Club, Gareth Meredith, Andy Timpson, Jason White and Craig Luddick a 19 year old overseas player from Durban in South Africa.

The Season in the TCL under the captaincy of Paul Sussex was mediocre the 1<sup>st</sup> X1 finished 13<sup>th</sup>, despite having 2 bowlers in the top 10 of the bowling averages. Kyle Holmes actually topped the averages with 48 wickets at 9.18, Paul Sussex was 8<sup>th</sup> with 32 wickets at 16.90. In the batting Ryland Wallace with 583 runs at 36.43 and Matthew Morris with 417 runs at 29.78 were the only batsmen to make an impression. Ryland Wallace's total included a magnificent 129. Interestingly 4 of the top ten in the batting averages were either overseas players or Professionals. Mark Douglas who has played One Day Internationals for New Zealand, Andrew Roseberry of Leicestershire and Glamorgan, A Daly and P Russell both Australian Grade 1 players

This year Abergavenny Cricket Club celebrates its 160th Anniversary having been founded in 1834 and moved to its current home at Avenue Road in 1896.

The club runs three senior sides together with under 13 and under 15 teams and takes an active interest with local schools developing young cricketers whatever their skills level or ability.

The 1st and 2nd XI play in the WG Cricket Three Counties League which has developed over the years to become the strongest competition in the area. Glamorgan players Adrian Dale (Chepstow) and Steve James (Lydney) together with Somerset and Englands' Andrew Caddick (Clevedon) bear witness to the league strength. In addition Hamish Anthony (Glamorgan) played for Abergavenny in 1990 and went on to be a member of the West Indies team to tour England in 1991.

The 3rd XI play in the Glamorgan and Gwent Cricket Conference and both the U13 and U15 sides take part in local leagues through an active youth policy, qualified coaching staff help to develop youngsters by visiting local primary schools for coaching sessions and by holding a practice night on the ground every Friday. The sight of up to 100 enthusiastic young people, including some girls, is a very satisfying experience and will hopefully provide the club with a very secure basis for many years to come. The rewards from such a commitment to youth cricket are already evident with many progressing to representative honours and making 1st team appearances at an early age.

The fore-runner to the present day generation of potential first class cricketers was Malcolm Nash who played as a young man at Abergavenny before moving on to enjoy 18 very successful years with Glamorgan which included two years as their club captain and was a member of the Championship winning team of 1969.

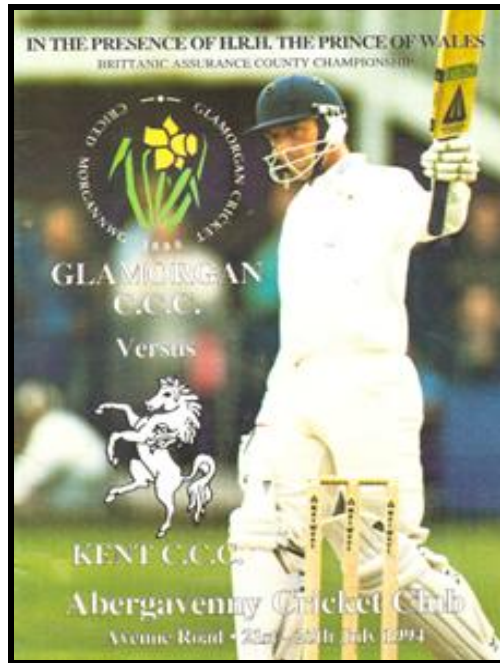
That initial link with Glamorgan is one which has continued until the present day and we are proud to continue to be associated with the County.

Since 1981 when Glamorgan played a Sunday League fixture against Worcestershire there has been a championship fixture at Avenue Road. Many international and test match players have crossed the boundary rope, perhaps none more famous than Viv Richards and Ian Botham when playing in opposing sides for Glamorgan and Worcester in 1990. That match also included test stars, Graham Hick, Hugh Morris, Matthew Maynard, Steve Watkin, Richard Illingworth, and more recently Steve Rhodes. The game itself was a series of cricket milestones with 1639 runs score for the loss of only 16 wickets and Glamorgan failing by just two runs in their second innings to get the target of 494 set by Worcestershire, the match ending in a draw.

Informality, enjoyment and good cricket have all become a feature of County Cricket at Avenue Road and over the years Abergavenny has developed a reputation second to none in both the amateur and professional ranks as one of the best social and hospitable venues to visit. We intend that tradition will continue for many years to come.

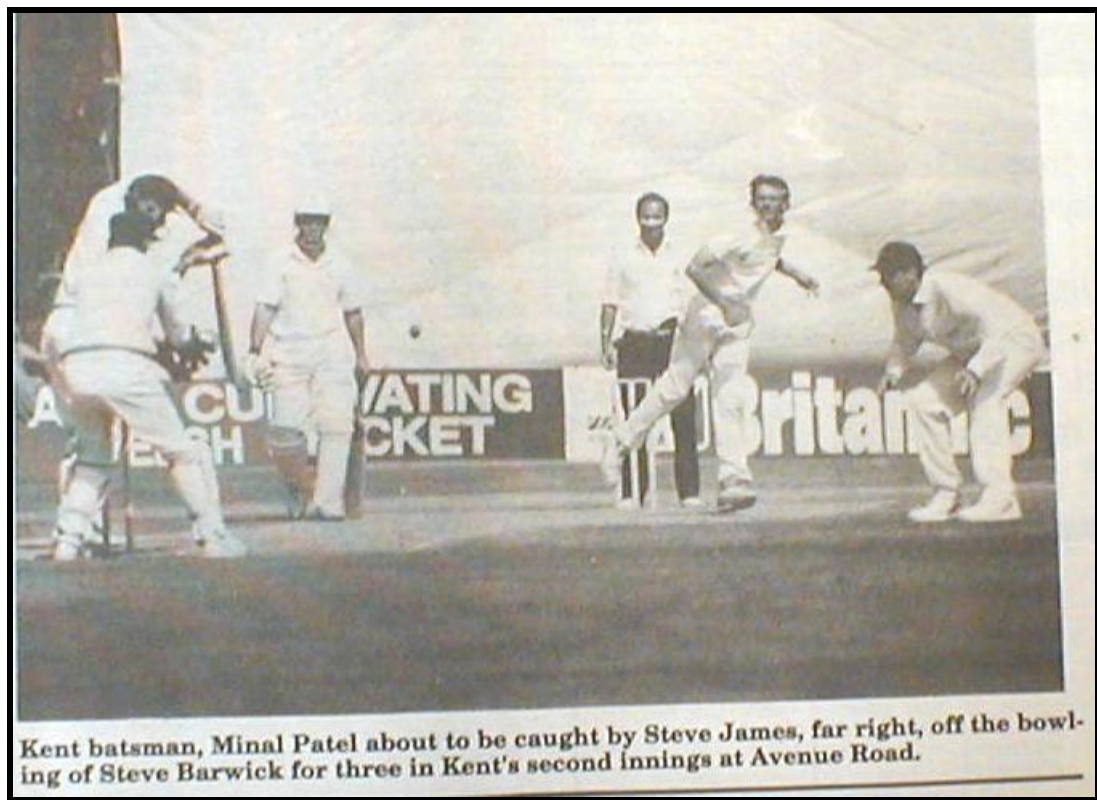


## Glamorgan v Kent

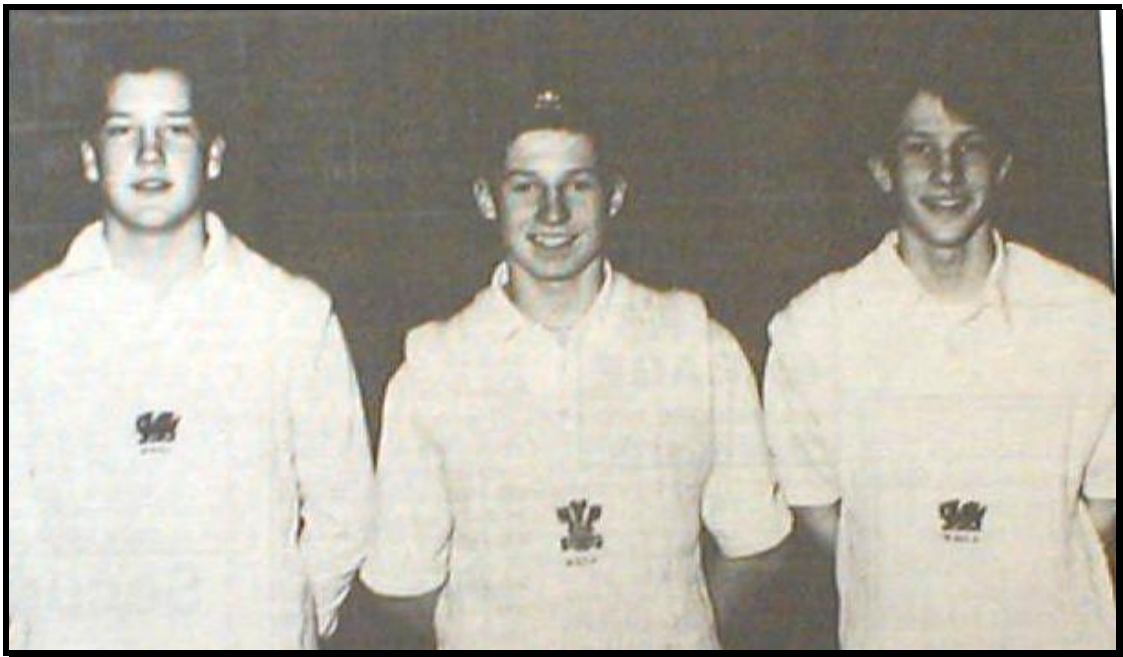

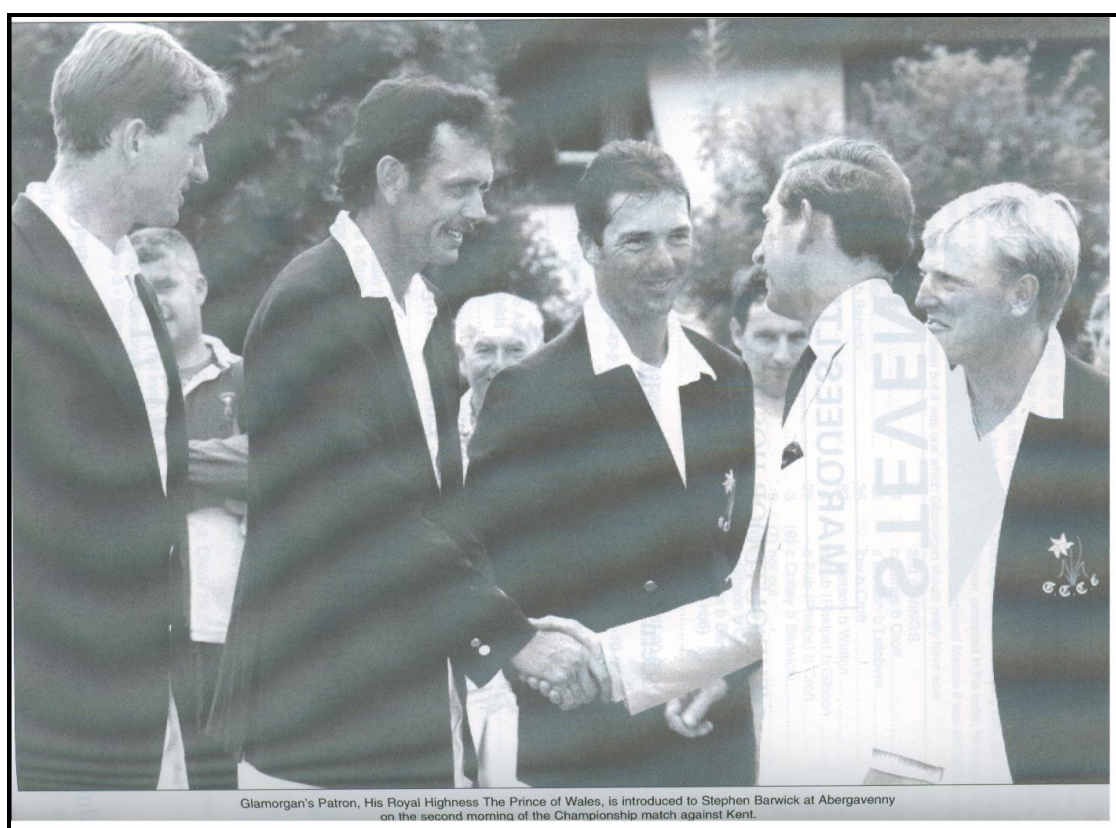
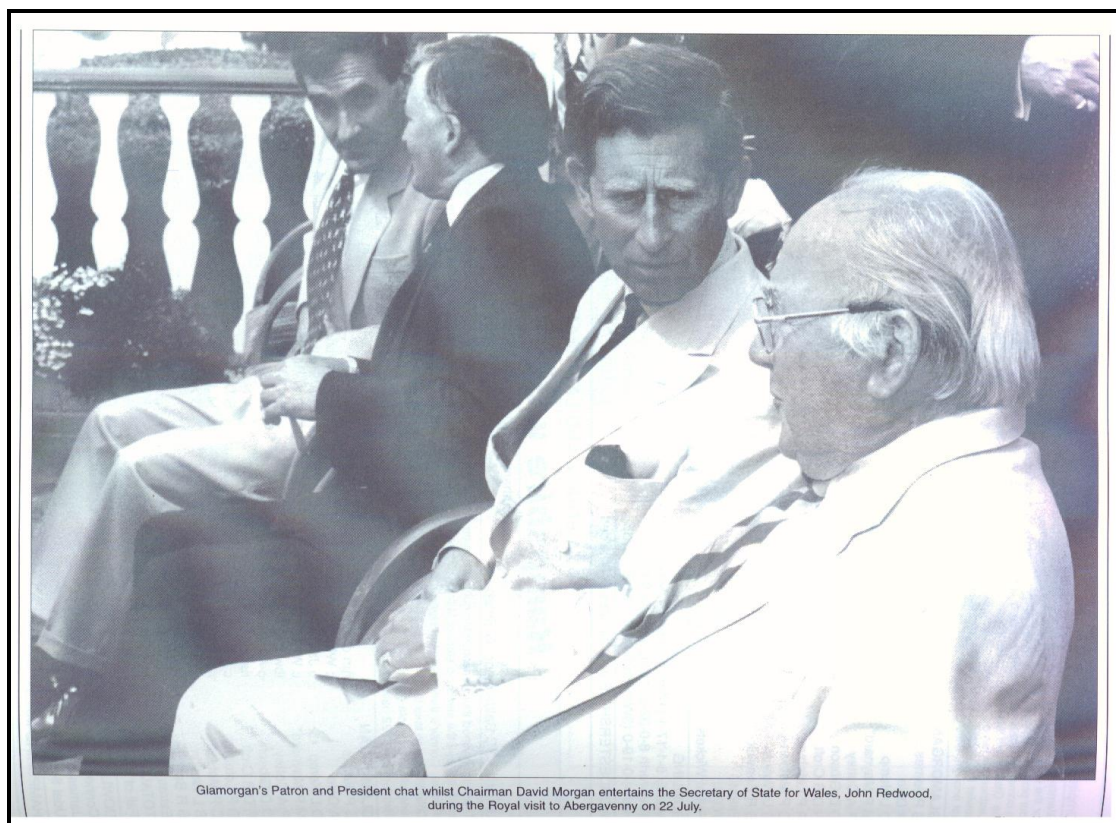

The First TCL match of the season was against Bredon who scored 184-9 K.Holmes 4-48, R.Beaumont 3-45. Abergavenny in reply won by 6 wickets Abergavenny 185-4 Jason White (91\*) Gareth Meredith (42) Mike Powell (21)

In the TCL matches continued, Abergavenny 248-5 R.Wallace (81) P.Jones (64\*) in reply Abergavenny restricted Hatherley to 205-10 K.Holmes 4-29 and R.Beaumont 2-39. Brockhampton 197-8 Paul Sussex 3-37 K.Carlson 2-40, K.Holmes 2-60 Abergavenny winning by 3 wickets scoring 198-7 R.Wallace (74) G.Meredith (58) Soundly beaten in the next game by Kington who scored 224-6 Aussie T.Daly (84) R.Beaumont 2-77. Abergavenny 146 all out R.Wallace (35\*) G.Meredith (68) Chepstow game was spoiled by rain as they struggled to 148-9 with K.Holmes taking 6-63. Both Cirencester and Bridgend matches were rained off. Before Clevedon inflicted a defeat, Clevedon 156 all out K.Holmes 6-58, Abergavenny 108 all out G.Meredith (21) G.Thomas (21)

Cardiff defeated Abergavenny in the Macey with Abergavenny only scoring a disappointing 90.

Dumbleton were bowled out for 166 with Kyle Holmes taking 5 for 38, this was after Abergavenny had reached 190-9 G.Thomas (20) M.Morris(46) M.Powell (43) and K.Holmes (28)

Malpas were then beaten, Abergavenny 234-6 J.White (92) O.Dawkins(25) A.Wright (58) Gareth Meredith (26\*) Malpas managed to reach 200-7 G.Meredith 2 for 39

Frocester easily beat Abergavenny in the next game, Abergavenny 133 all out M.Winstanley (56) Frocester 135-2 A.Timpson 1-36 Paul Sussex 1-20

What seems like the annual tie took place against Sudbrook Abergavenny 157-6 R.Wallace (84) A.Wright (37) Sudbrook 157-6 with G.Meredith and Mike James taking 2 wickets each. An embarrassing defeat came next against Panteg who themselves were bowled out for 159. Paul Sussex with 6-53. Unfortunately Abergavenny were all out for 81 with only R.Wallace (21) and Phil Jones (16\*) scoring anything worthwhile.

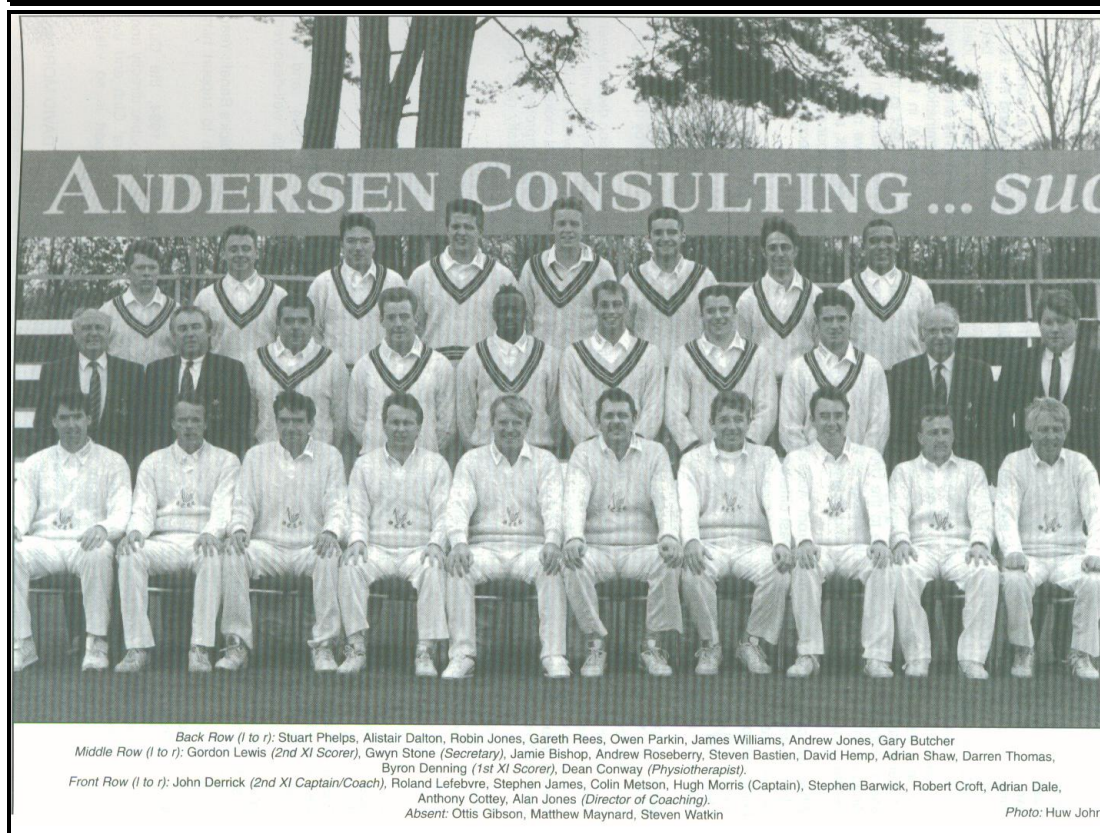
