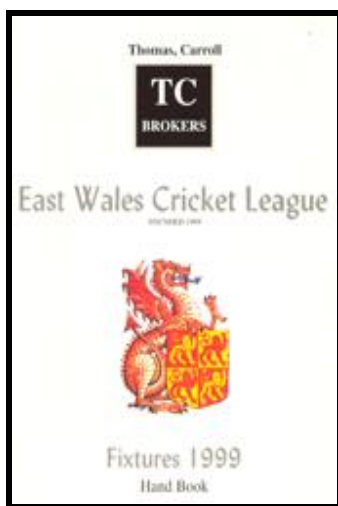

Abergavenny started the campaign well with a resounding 9 wicket victory over local rivals Usk who were dismissed for a paltry 39, Ross Lupton taking 6-13. Usk 2nd X1 175-9 Sam Timpson 3-34. Abergavenny 2nd X1 179-5 Mark Winstanley [72] Lee James [45*] John Phillips registered a century (131) against Llanwern before St Fagans suffered the same fate as Usk all out for 56, Lupton 6-32 and J.Hughes 3-28 doing the damage with Steve Brown 52 not out in Abergavenny's reply. Croesyceiliog were the next opponents in the Welsh Intermediate Cup, batting first Abergavenny totalled 284-8 three players passed 50, Steve Brown, Geraint Jones and Owen Dawkins. Croesyceiliog 198 all out, Andrew Coles 3-41. Abergavenny secured their 3rd consecutive victory against Panteg, batting first Abergavenny scored 193-6, with M.Wallace 67 and John Phillips 37. Panteg only managed 173 all out J.Hughes 3-30, P.Sussex 3-36.

Rain caused abandonment's, including the game against Llanarth, which was poised on a knife edge, chasing the small total of 123 to win Llanarth were 62-3 when the rain came. Abergavenny were far too strong for Chepstow in the Welsh League scoring 221-5, All of the batsmen contributed but Lupton top scored with 56. Chepstow were 150-6 at the close, Dawkins, Meredith and Barnsley taking 2 wickets each.

The big clash with Newport fell victim to the weather, not before Lupton had bowled Ian Thomas and the score was 26-1 when the rain came.

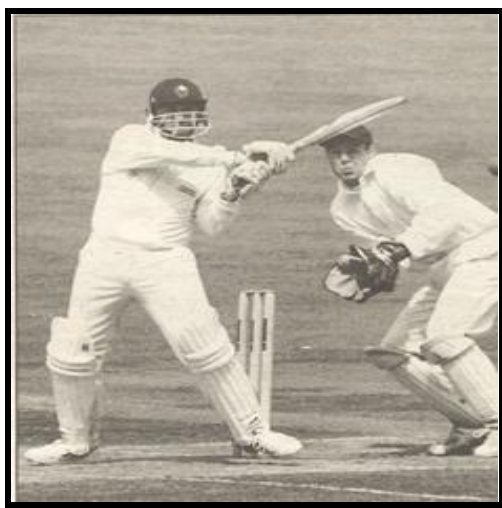
Chepstow were next up in the league and they were duly beaten despite scoring 241, R.Lupton taking 2-62. Mark Wallace with (92) saw Abergavenny home by 3 wkts.

The Cardiff game was abandoned, Cardiff had scored 240-3 Abergavenny were reasonably well placed with G.Jones (62) M.Wallace (19) Ross Lupton (36*) in reply.

Local rivals Usk were narrowly beaten by 6 runs. Abergavenny 226-8, Usk all out 220 Geraint Jones was the hero scoring (68) and taking 4 wickets for 27 runs, M.Wallace (58) J.Phillips (33) Sam Timpson 4-39. Sudbrook beat Abergavenny in the Cup with young Ben Pike 3-37 making his mark. Revenge came in the league as Sudbrook were bowled out for 117 Ross Lupton 6-35, M.Baillon 2-2 before Abergavenny with Lupton scoring (62) ran out easy winners by 7 wickets.

The 'double' over St Fagans was secured in a high scoring game. St Fagans 242-5 Mike Baillon 2-73, Abergavenny 243-8 Ross Lupton (62)G.Jones (40) M.Baillon (46)J.Phillips (52)

A second 'double' came against Panteg winning by 9 wickets chasing 183 Ross Lupton 3-37, P.Sussex 3-54 G.Meredith 2-47 Mark Wallace with a magnificent 103 not out the hero, Ross Lupton (62*)

The match that probably was the title decider came next at Newport they were bowled out for 159 R.Lupton 6-31,P.Sussex 3-41 and J.Hughes 1-45. In reply Geraint Jones with (50) and M.Coles (21) ensured the game went to the wire, Mike Baillon and Paul Sussex who were the last pair at the wicket edged Abergavenny home by 1 wicket.

Chepstow failed to chase the 190 needed to win John Phillips (76) they were bowled out 72 runs short, Gareth Meredith 5-16, P.Sussex 3-21 which included a hat trick with the last 3 wickets to fall. Abergavenny 189-7 G.Jones (30) J.Phillips (76) R.Lupton (31)

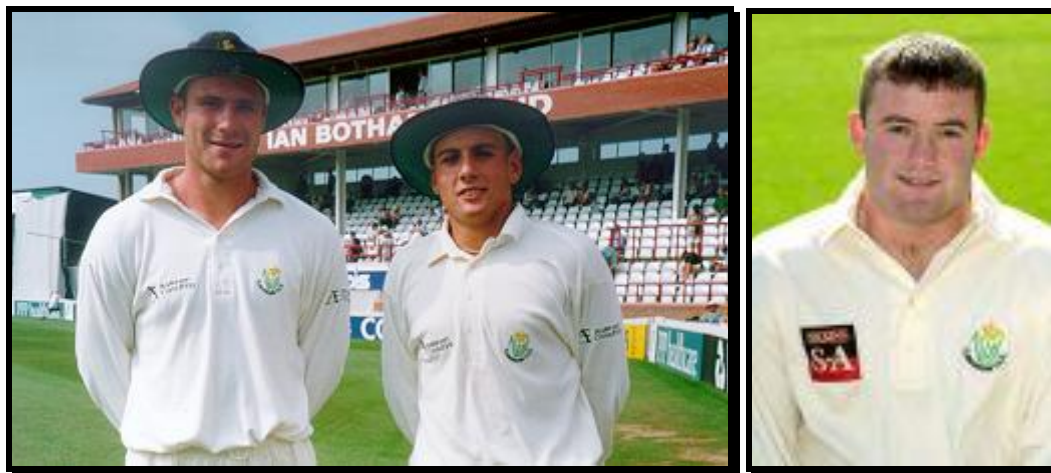
Mark Wallace topped the 2nd X1 Averages in 1999

Abergavenny 2nd X1 Played 14 Won 11 Lost 3 and 1 Abandoned- Ian Harris topped the Bowling averages with 30 wickets at 14.9, G.Corfield 15 wkts at 19, Sam Timpson 9 wkts at 22.6, Craig Barnsley 15 wkts at 24.5, Ben Pike 7 wickets at 25.5, Mike Devoy 7 wkts at 29.1, Andy Timpson 10 wkts at 34.6, Phil Christie 7 wkts at 38.1 Others that bowled G.Pritchard, P.Havard, A.Coles, P.Sussex, S.Brown, C.Thomas, H.Charrington. Lee James topped the Batting averages with 378 runs at 63 with a high score of 157 Not Out, Steve Brown 290 runs at 58 with a high score of 156, The other centurion was Gavin White 108 Not Out. Highest Aggregate was 400 runs by Mark Winstanley- Youth Section

Under 11 team finished mid table- with Jonathon Johns, Alex Denning, Adam Fury, John-Jo Sidwell, Harry Schofield & Andrew Spencer all promising. The Under 13's finished runners up in the league and winning the Cup against Blackwood in the Final- Coach Ian Hatchley. The Under 15's managed by Graham Pike finished runners up in the league but lost to Sudbrook in both Cup competitions.

The Under 19's reached the Macey semi final.

Wales MC v Herefordshire at Abergavenny

In a rain affected MCCU Trophy game reduced to shorteighted overs per side, Wales proved to be the stronger on the day. After taking two early wickets with the score at 27 and a third when the total was 84, a fourth wicket stand of 139 between K M Bell and R Sylvester resulted in Herefordshire chasing a total some 30-40 runs larger than expected after the initial 10-15 overs. The short boundary on the pavilion side of the ground notwithstanding the batsmen to play their shots, it was ironic that the major contribution for Wales came from R Sylvester, who was registered with Herefordshire in 1998. The Herefordshire wicketkeeper, Steve Abbead, was injured in the twenty-sixth over, which resulted in a visit to hospital, the damage being repaired with six stitches. The Hereford innings never really started after the run out of the captain, Harshad Patel, from a direct hit, and the dismissal of Chris Donoghue by a brilliant catch, further run outs, falling light and interruptions through showers disrupted any momentum in the innings, although a late contribution by Lee Caldwell showed that this side was capable of a watch hence all-round performance. Defeats were made by Rav Nagra and Steve Abbead.
