Beavers urged to lift their intensity $May 9^{th}$

FOLLOWING last week's washout, Abergavenny CC's First X1 had high hopes of getting their first win of the season against Croesyceiliog.

It started well, with captain Gavin Heritage winning the toss on an overcast morning and putting the opposition in to bat on a damp pitch.

Croesyceiliog found themselves 37-2, with Dan Cooke and Nathan Byrne exerting early pressure with commendable accuracy. The pendulum swung in Croesyceiliog's favour with a 79-run partnership before another flurry of wickets fell from a spell of threatening bowling from Dinesh Rex and Abergavenny's rising young spinner Scott Greaves.

With Cooke leaving the field for hospital treatment after he dislocated his shoulder following a calamitous collision with a steel upright, Abergavenny had to change their death-bowling plans. Through a combination of determination, good running between the wickets and a few slices of luck Croesyceiliog finished on 226-9 from their 50 overs.

Abergavenny's innings had a promising start, with openers James Hrastelj and Will Glenn looking solid and scoring easily, until Glenn succumbed to an in-swinger trying to force the pace.

A comfortable partnership began to build until two wickets fell in quick succession. Hrastelj chipped a plugging off-spinner to midwicket and Heritage was controversially run out. Abergavenny fought their way to 145-3 with Andy Clarke and Tamoor Zafar playing some excellent shots, and looked set to chase the target down.

Another piece of ill fortune broke the partnership when Tamoor inside-edged a short ball onto his pads, which trickled back and agonisingly disturbed the bails. A monumental collapse then ensued, with Abergavenny losing their remaining wickets for just 13 runs, ending 68 runs shy of the target.

Abergavenny must rapidly lift the intensity, determination and application if they are to fulfil their ambitions of a high table finish this year. Everyone at the club sincerely wishes Dan Cooke a speedy recovery from what a doctor at the scene described as "a nasty looking injury".

2nd X₁v Lisvane

Abergavenny seconds eased to a comfortable victory at Lisvane on Saturday. Captain Gareth Powell led the way with 45, David Glinos chipped in with 32, Richard Roberts hit a quickfire 40, Nathan Holley finished on 27 not out but the top score was veteran Barry Sharpe as he scored 62. 266-6 from 45 overs always seemed too much for Lisvane but they made an excellent start as the openers scored 102 between them.

But wickets soon tumbled with Andy Timpson and Matthew Knight taking three each, Chaitanya Sanapala taking the one wicket and Powell with the last two as Lisvane finished on 192-9.

.....the Crickhowell wicket was eminently playable and the game was able to start promptly at 1pm. Luctonian's skipper Steve Powell won the toss and immediately asked Abergavenny to bat first. Beavers openers Tom Griffiths (18) and Drew Heffernan (10) belied the overhead conditions to get the home side off to a comfortable start, however a couple of quick wickets meant skipper Steve Brown and Lee Fury had to set about a repair job.

They had moved the score to 70-3 before Brown was well taken at slip for a patient 15. Fury lost further allies until he was joined by youngster Kyle Holmes who immediately set about pushing the Beavers total towards 150. The pair were batting with freedom and fluency which had deserted the middle order and looked on course to post a very challenging first innings total before Fury was run out for an excellent 33. Holmes began to marshall the lower order and combined solid defence with vicious attack to end the innings as Beavers top scorer with 36 as Abergavenny were bowled out for 145 in the final over. Skipper Steve Brown felt this total was a little below par but had confidence that his side were still in the contest as the players broke for the tea interval.

On resumption under heavier skies, Beavers opening bowlers Tom Griffiths (2-28) and Meici Jones (2-18) took advantage of the overhead conditions to restrict the visitors to 5-2 during the early exchanges. A few lusty blows from Bengry threatened Abergavennys low total but he was well bowled by Griffiths before he could alter the Luctonians tempo. Beavers change bowlers of James Aurelius (2-14) and Kyle Holmes (2-8) kept the pressure on the visitors as they continued to pick up regular wickets. Some excellent outfielding and catching by the home side ensured that Lucs could not build any telling partnerships and Lucs number three, Whizz Ettinger saw partners come and go as he was left high and not

so dry on 33* as the Beavers bowled the opposition out for 76.

Tamoor hits Usk hard in 50 run victory

AFTER their Herculean last-over victory against Pontypridd last week, Abergavenny approached their local derby against Usk with renewed vigour and a determined intent.

This fixture usually produces some of the best cricket of the season, and Saturday was no different. Abergavenny captain, Gavin Heritage, won the toss on a scorching afternoon and decided to bat. Usk struck quickly when Will Glenn miss-hit a lofted drive to mid off and in walked Tamoor Zafar. Already recognised as a great talent, Tamoor established himself as a key run-scorer for Abergavenny last week with a tough century and

was hoping to build on his form.

Abergavenny's batting line up had been bolstered further by the return of Andrew Jones, who has long been the rock of their innings. Tamoor and Jones quickly began to dominate the bowling, as glorious drives were followed by dismissive pull shots.

With the scoring rattling along to reach 160-1, Usk looked in serious trouble until Jones failed to properly connect with a short ball and found the hands of the mid-wicket fielder, falling for 73. However, this had no effect on Tamoor, who continued to dispatch the Usk bowlers to all corners of the ground and beyond. Six balls were lost in the last few overs as each one in succession flew out of the ground. To whatever the bowlers tried Tamoor had the answers. Abergavenny's middle and lower order contributed well to a series of quick-scoring partnerships as the total flew to 314-9 off their 50 overs.

Abergavenny's huge total put pressure on the Usk batsmen from the start, as the required run rate crept up with every tight over.

Opening bowler Nathan Byrne had been finding his form and fitness in recent weeks, but proved to be the spearhead Abergavenny were looking for this week.

By bowling tight lines with aggression and movement Byrne took the edge of Usk's star batsman, Iain Clayton and Abergavenny saw an opening.

Despite several gritty partnerships by the Usk batsmen, the wickets continued to fall at regular intervals, with Andy Clarke, Scott Greaves and Tamoor taking two wickets each. Oliver James was the standout batsman for Usk, scoring a well-fought 58 off just 61 balls, before he fell to a stunning catch on the boundary by Dinesh Rex. Clarke and Byrne mopped up the tail and Abergavenny celebrated a fantastic 50-run victory. Having climbed to fourth in the league, Abergavenny look to another 'crunch' game next week at Avenue Road against fifth-placed Sudbrook.


