

Whilst Abergavenny Cricket Club are preparing for the 2017 Season, one of its greatest luminaries Mark Wallace has announced his Immediate retirement from First Class Cricket. Very few precocious Sportsmen in any Field go on to fulfil that early promise as they grow older. Mark is an exception to that rule. Ever since he captained Powys Under 12 County Side he has continued to progress, very often playing in Older age groups. He has been synonymous with 'firsts' ever since he became the first player ever to score a century in the Final of the Welsh National Schools Under 13 Cricket Tournament. Glamorgan CCC recognised his ability early on and invited him for two winters running to specialist Nets with them In 1997 Mark was playing 2nd X1 County Championship Cricket whilst still eligible for Under 17 Competition Cricket for Glamorgan, which incidentally they won........

- 2003- Mark also became the County's youngest ever capped wicket keeper when he was presented with his cap on June 16th at Cardiff.







Abergavenny 2nd XI began their league campaign at a blustery Chepstow CC on Saturday and were blown away in the final phase of the game to go down by 115 runs.

The emphatic nature of the result does not tell the whole story as the Beavers were in the game for long periods but just could not maintain their challenge in the final 20 overs.

Aber skipper Steve Brown lost the toss and home counterpart Jon Huws had no hesitation in batting first. The track and the outfield were very hard and dry for early May which meant a par score was expected to be around 225.

Beavers youngster Ben Morris had other ideas though and picked up 2 wickets in his first over, both caught well at slip by the nimble Andy Timpson. Morris was unlucky not to pick up a third wicket, but the chance went down at 2nd slip, with the beneficiary, Bostock, going on to make a solid 61.

Skipper Brown was in the enviable position of having 8 bowlers to rotate, but having lost Francois Lodder to a rib strain when in a good rhythm, no one else was able to take control until wily seamer Gareth Powell (3-30) produced a magical 9 over spell to wrestle back some initiative for the Aber team. However, Jones (71) and skipper Huws (32) had taken the Chepstow score to 180-3 with 12 overs to go and a score well in excess of 250 was looking a distinct possibility. Brown turned back to spin and was instantly rewarded as young leggy Tom Pipe took 2 good wickets and Timpson 1 which wrestled back the impetus for the away team. Ben Morris returned for a second spell and picked up a 3rd wicket to leave the Chepstow innings at 219-9 which represented an excellent come back by Abergavenny. Chepstow included a boy called Ben Kellaway who 6 years later would figure in the Glamorgan CCC side in the Metro Bank One Day Cup as indeed would Abergavenny boy Ben Morris.

Beavers openers Powell and Nathan Holley made a promising start and the pusuit of 220 for victory looked well within range, however, Powell misjudged the line of a Tim Rees delivery and found himself on his way back to the pavillion for 13. When Ieuan Fury, on his Beavers comeback, fell soonafter it was left to Steve Brown (29) and Nathan Holley (23) to steady the ship. After Holley departed, Brown and Griffiths (22) took the score along to 96-3 with more than 20 overs remaining in the run chase. At this stage, the game could have gone either way, however, young Chepstow off spinner Lewys Jones showed the benefits of pitching the ball up as he first dismissed Griffiths, followed by Brown in the next over. The equation was now looking very different as the injured Lodder was unable to bat leaving the Beavers effectively 100-6. Jones continued to torment the Aber batsmen and finshed with 5-24 as Aber lost their last 7 wickets for only 8 runs in the space of 5 overs.

The final margin of defeat and the rapid middle order collapse was a little harsh on the young Beavers side, but there were a number of positives to take out of the game as Aber look to immediately reverse their fortunes with a home game against Pentyrch this Saturday (13th May).

Abergavenny 2nds pulled off a remarkable victory against Pentyrch to open their account for the season. With much rain on the Avenue Rd ground in the preceding 48 hours the toss was all important and luckily for the home side, Aber's vice captain Tom Griffiths stepped up to the mark and won the coin flip and immediately asked Pentyrch to bat first.

Abergavenny's youthful opening attack of Ben Morris (1-15) and Dylan Beaumont-Welsh settled into an early rhythm and it was only some lusty blows from Luke Szpadt and a few edges from the other end that caused the Beavers an early concern. Beaumont-Welsh (3-30) picked up Szpadt in his 3rd over as the Pentyrch man attempted to clear the infield once again, only to be well held at mid on by Beavers skipper Steve Brown. This triggered a top order collapse an Pentyrch lost a further 5 wickets for the addition of only 32 runs to leave them reeling at 58-6. For Aber, the wickets were shared around with miserly spells from both Gareth Powell (2-17) and Craig Whistance (1-13) who both managed to extract both seam movement and bounce out of the drying track. Pentyrch number 6 Andrew Sheard (49) provided a solid counter attack and was ably supported down the order by Johnston and skipper Mike Saltmarsh who managed to elevate the visitors total to 137 before the last wicket fell to Beavers spinner Andy Timpson who ended with excellent figures of 3-29.

At the interval, although pleased with another excellent bowling performance, Beavers skipper Steve Brown was conscious that a flurry of early wickets would mean chasing even a modest total of 138 for victory could prove difficult.

As Abergavenny began their chase the Pentyrch opening bowlers Luke Szpadt (1-25) and Saajan Ali (4-13) provided the headache that the Beavers team did not want to endure as they ripped out the Aber top order with a combination of pace and persistent line and length, leaving the home side in tatters at 26-5 after 15 overs. Lee Fury (31) was the only batsman in the top order to reach double figures and after he departed in the 22nd over with only 52 runs on the board most of the home faithful could be forgiven for thinking their chances had gone with that dismissal.

Bring to the crease 13-year-old Tom Pipe who with his senior partner Craig Whistance began reconstructing the

Aber innings. Both batsmen played sensible cricket and waited for anything wayward from the Pentyrch change bowlers for their scoring opportunities. 52-6 soon became 90-6 and the Aber faithful hitherto silenced by pain, began to believe once more.

Pipe (25) and Whistance began to look increasingly assured, and with the Pentyrch opening bowlers long since bowled out, the equation was down to an achievable 47 required off the last 10 overs.

The 36th over proved as decisive as any in the last 10 as Whistance cleared the ropes with a huge six over mid wicket as the Beavers pair managed to score 13 runs off the over. Further sensible batting from both reduced the equation to a mere 10 runs required off the final 4 overs, however, the tables potentially turned once more as Pipe was finally dismissed following a mammoth 20 over stay with Whistance during which they put on 76 runs. Dylan

Beaumont-Welsh came out to join Whistance and despite a few alarms it was fittingly left for the Herculean Whistance (47*) to hit the winning runs through extra cover to turn a fantastic game of cricket firmly on its head one final time.

Despite the low scores, the standard of cricket was excellent and it proved to the Beavers side that they are capable of competing at this level following a few barren years.

Credit goes to the Pentyrch side, who not only contributed to a fantastic game of cricket, but played the game in the spirit to which every club cricketer should aspire.

Beavers hope to continue their winning ways with an away trip to Newbridge this coming Saturday (20th May).

Abergavenny 2nds completed a quite astonishing victory for the second consecutive week after overcoming Newbridge by 2 wickets.

Having travelled to Newbridge through a number of heavy showers, it was no surprise to the Beavers players to see the wicket covered as they arrived. Another heavy downpour shortly after arrival meant that the start time was delayed and the match reduced to 40 overs per side.

With a slight wet patch on the track, the toss was all-important and Beavers skipper Steve Brown managed to call correctly and asked the Newbridge side to bat first.

Ben Morris and Dylan Beaumont-Welsh opened up for Aber and were soon amongst the wickets as Morris (1-29) bowled Wellington for a duck. However, the procession of wickets that Aber had hoped for did not materialise as a combination of dropped chances and good batting meant that Newbridge passed 120 with no further alarms. Brown juggled his attack in search of a wicket and was finally rewarded when young Tom Pipe had Chris James stumped by Nathan Holley for 54. This wicket brought Cael Jones to the crease and he set about elevating the Newbridge total towards the 200 mark. Despite the rain, the Newbridge track played extremely well, which allowed Jones to hit confidently through the line of the ball and he was rewarded with 5 sixes in a quick fire 62. Euan Tippings had anchored the Newbridge innings throughout and ended with an excellent 85* leaving the home side with an imposing 233-3 from their 40 overs.

At the tea interval the Beavers players were ruing their missed chances but felt a strong start could give them a platform to chase the formidable total.

Gareth Powell (15) once again looking in excellent touch striking 2 fluent boundaries before being strangled down the leg side. Lee Fury, Tom Griffiths and Nathan Holley looked to be in little trouble but were all out when looking to accelerate the scoring. At 59-4 the Newbridge target looked extremely distant. Chai Sanapala and Brown to the Aber innings past the half way mark, at which stage the Beavers needed 144 to win with 5 wickets in hand. After Sanapala and Pipe had departed, Brown started to farm the strike in a last ditch attempt the exploit the short boundary and give Aber a chance coming in to the last 10 overs. With 8 overs remaining, Aber needed 88 to win with 3 wickets left. By this point Brown had moved past his 50 and was looking to hit a couple of boundaries an over to keep the Beavers in touch. The plan was working, and with 6 overs to go the equation was


down to less than 70 required for victory with Brown managing to pass 3 figures along the way. Brown and Beaumont-Welsh had enjoyed an 8th wicket partnership of 51 in less than 5 overs before Beaumont-Welsh was caught on the boundary for 8 with exactly 50 still needed for victory. Brown was then joined by youngster Ben Morris and combining some further lusty blows from Brown and some scrambled running from both, the equation was down to 27 off the final 3 overs. Brown hit the 1st ball of the 48th over for 6 to reduce the target to 21 off 17 balls, a further 2 and a single off the final ball meant the Beavers needed 18 off the final 2. Again Brown hit the first ball of the over for 6, leaving 12 to win off 11 balls. Brown managed to secure the strike for the final over with 5 runs need for victory. A no-ball from the first ball was followed by 2 dots, however, a legside half volley from the 3rd legitimate ball of the over was tickled down to fine leg for the winning boundary and Aber had managed to win in the most dramatic of fashions. Brown and Morris had managed a stand of 50 runs during which Morris had faced 1 ball which he sensibly placed for a single to get Brown back on strike. Beavers skipper Brown ended the game unbeaten on 154 which included 18 fours and 9 sixes.

This victory was every bit as dramatic as the previous week and means the Beavers keep much needed momentum and confidence going into this Saturdays home fixture against Whitchurch Heath.



Saturday May 27th saw the first team travel to Whitchurch Heath for an attempt to record a first league win away from home in over a year. After a delayed start due to rain, skipper Leach won an important toss and in muggy and damp conditions elected to bowl first. With the game reduced to 45 overs per side, the Abergavenny bowlers started well with David Clarke getting the first wicket with the score on just four. A nine over spell from Adam Harrison going for 20 runs built pressure on the Whitchurch Batsmen who struggled to play the swinging ball in tough batting conditions. Back bowling from a long term shoulder injury, Dan Cooke helped to remove the middle order with three wickets in an exciting spell of seam bowling. This was backed up by good fielding from an Aber side playing with good intensity and ruthlessness. Whitchurch All out for 130. The Aber chase got off to a shaky start by losing a wicket in the first over. A 50 partnership from Will Glenn and Morgan Bevans then steadied the ship, casting away any doubt in what should be a straight forward run chase. With both batsmen failing to see out the victory, the Aber middle order had to chip in to knock off the remaining runs, which included a very mature and measured innings of 34 not out from Lewis Holley. The win came in the 28th over for the away side, finishing on 131-5 and taking Aber to second in the league. Aber's first team are on the road again next week for three weekend fixtures, including Newport in the Macey Cup on Friday, Rogerstone in the league on Saturday and Cardiff in the second round of the Welsh Cup on Sunday. 3rd X1 v Moccas CC was Cancelled
