The AGM was held in the Greyhound Hotel, the Committee elected- WR Lewis, HC Pryer, JC James, JO Davies, M.Harris and G.Kick. RW Powell and EW Barrett retired from the Committee. For the 1911 season the club engaged the services of A.G.Woodeson of Reading as the Club Professional.

A new Pavilion was built thanks to the kindness of the Marquess of Abergavenny.

The 1st X1 played a total of seventeen (17) winning nine (9) Losing four (4) Drawing four (4) and two (2) matches were abandoned. Whilst the 2nd X1 Played fourteen (14) winning six (6) losing eight (8) For the first time the Club ran a Thursday X1 and for 1911 a list of fixtures were arranged for Thursdays in order to give some of the members the opportunity of match cricket, which they had hitherto been denied owing to their inability to play on Saturdays. Under the Captaincy of AG Morgan they Played12, Won 6, Drew 3, Lost 3 and had 3 matches abandoned. The Batting award for the 2nd X1 went to H.Bevan and the Bowling award went to B.W.Lewis. The County game this year was Monmouthshire v Cornwall

The 1911 Season opened in Abergavenny in early May with the 1st X1 travelling to Monmouth while the 2nd X1 entertained Croesyceilog at home. The new Pavilion which is due to be completed in a few weeks time is a much larger and more commodious structure than the old one, the enlargements and improvements to the ground will ensure Abergavenny will have one of the best cricket enclosures in Wales or on the borders.

By the time the 1st X1 played their first home game in the 3rd week of May the Pavilion was nearing completion, when finished as already stated, Abergavenny would possess a ground without equal west of the Severn Sea. The visitors were Cardiff St. Marys who included in their side the crack bowler Plater. JR Jacob was not available due to illness, JO Davies was missing as was P.Everall and JC James.In 1911 the King Henry V111 Grammar School held their Annual Sports Day on the newly enlarged ground. The old belt of lofty trees which in former years formed the western boundary of the field having been removed. As that belt of trees had formerly housed the seats for spectators to enjoy the cricket in the shade, sunshades were universally used by the ladies who were present.
