 and drawing 9

1921 was a most interesting Season. Cardiff visited Abergavenny in 1921, and Norman Riches
 made (201*) which was a Cardiff and Ground record. When he was on 140 he was palpably
 caught behind but given not out as the Umpire believed everyone was enjoying his innings.
 The previous best was held by HG Symonds with [195] against Swansea. In reply Abergavenny
 lost 4 quick wickets to Nash who at that time was enjoying First class cricket success. But the
 game was saved in style with JR Jacob playing the innings of his life (69*) When making his
 first appearance of the 1921 Season Dr Tresawna scored (102*) against Malpas . He signalled

his intent with a fine display of stylish and forceful batsmanship, hitting thirteen 4's and four 6's. B.Arthur also made a half century in Abergavenny's total of 209-6 declared. In reply Malpas were 96-3 at the close. B.Arthur 2-20 and WH Robinson 1-7. Collis Bishop gave a great display behind the stumps. The Club were free from debt at the start of the 1921 season which was the first time that had happened since moving to the Penypound Ground in 1896.
