The Chronicle reported......

"The clerk of the weather has not given a very cheerful welcome to the opening of summer sports." Nevertheless optimism and enthusiasm prevails on the Avenue Road ground. Mead has got the cricket ground in good shape and some good sport should be seen with a strong team and excellent fixtures. Last season the Sunday games were a feature and they were practically all favoured with remarkably fine weather. Should the same good fortune attend the club this season there will undoubtedly be large crowds on the Avenue Road ground enjoying their Sunday afternoons The first serious match was played on Sunday and both players and spectators needed to be rather hardy for the afternoon was cold and wet. Rain interrupted the game for considerable periods, nevertheless it was played to a conclusion and there was a good finish" This was to be the first year of Lew Whites involvement with the club and the last year of J.R. Jacobs involvement with the club, as at the 1948 AGM in the Greyhound Vaults his death was noted with sadness. The visitors were Mr Ray Faulks X1 from St Fagan's who provided a worthy opposition. The wicket was on the soft side and helped the bowlers and there was no prolific scoring. St Fagans who took first innings were 10-2 but managed to get to 103. F Nicholls 3-8 and captain SH Stock 3-13 took the bowling honours. Lew White the new coach took 1-23 and Cliff Cox 2-33. In reply Abergavenny were at one point 45-6 and later 56-8 however the tail wagged and the last wicket added 326, Abergavenny losing by 11 runs. SH Stock [24*] F.Nicholls [15] Lew White [13] Philips and Harris shared the 10 wickets for St Fagan's.

This was also the final season as Joint Secretary for S.R.C. Thomas who had held that office since 1936.

In 1947 a concrete wicket was introduced, this was made possible by Glamorgan C.C.C. who were looking to the future and encouraging talent in south Wales. The engagement of Lew White as a Coach indicated the Club's commitment to developing future cricketers and some 25 youngsters regularly turned up for the junior practice/coaching sessions. An Annexe to the Pavilion in the shape of an Army Hut was put in place

Playing wise 1947 was quoted as one of the most progressive seasons for some time

New Mid Week Knock Out League

It is not generally known by cricket patrons that there will be a match on Avenue Road ground every Saturday and Sunday throughout the summer. In addition a Mid week knock out competition has been arranged teams will have to stick to the rules laid down and no more than 3 'regular' cricketers per team. There will be 12 eight ball overs. Cost eight shillings per team

The teams were: Coopers, GPO, Rugby Club, KHGS, LMS, Seargents, Overdrafts, Ruthers, Police, OW gm, Old Boys, Thursdays, Br legion (a) and (b)The Rest, SWG, Llanfoist, PYF, Colts. The competition was won by the GPO.

A 2^{nd} X1 game with Hereford saw Hereford's 2nd X1 61 all out with Hill taking 5-6 in 5 overs, H.Bowkett taking 3 wickets for 25, and Pragnell taking 1 wicket. Abergavenny 83-9 H.Bowkett (27) and C.J.Cox (12)

Patrons will probably be interested to know the quality of sport that will be available to them on Sundays.. The visiting teams will include - Mr Brain's X1, Glamorgan Nomads, Mr Irvings Panteg X1, Monmouthshire Police, a Montgomeryshire X1, a Worcestershire X1-Including players who will play against Glamorgan CCC at Ebbw Vale. Carmarthen Wanderers, Sphinx [Neath] Mr JF Rust's Newport X1, Hereford, Cardiff Athletic and Brecon.

Adams and White, the coach opened the innings for Abergavenny and between them they put on 40 for the first wicket. White [25] wickets then fell regularly- 3rd and 4th wickets at 45, 5th for 47, 6th for 49, 8th for 69, Nicholls then came in and top scored with a lively [35] CJ Cox hit a six in his [13] and the last wicket added 26 for a total of 135. In reply Mr JH Brain's X1 Ebbw Vale fell 50 runs short. Lew White 6-34 and Syd Stock 5-23.

Tomorrow the club will send their 1^{st} X1 to play the boys as a nice gesture as the Captain of Christ College is the son of Abergavenny member Mr F.White. Then weather permitting at home the club face Lysaughts.

The First X1 were away at Brecon against Christ College who made 73 all out E.G.Nash taking 3 for 4. Two junior members played Gerry Alderton with 2-16 and Mel Pritchard who both bowled well. Lew White took 3-25. Abergavenny won by 4 wickets. Lew White (32) Bill Kemmey (18) and F.Nichols (26)

Despite the absence of skipper Syd Stock who was ill, a draw was achieved at Newport, Abergavenny all out for 139, T.Adams (18) W.Robinson (55) returning to the team after a long absence and F.G.Nichols scoring (35). Newport in reply were 114-2 with E.G.Nash taking the 2 wickets to fall.

Abergavenny 2nd X1 v Newport 'A' Newport 'A' winning by 2 wickets. Abergavenny 2nds being 84 all out Tovey (15) and C.Price (22)

Abergavenny played a match against a South Wales League X1 who scored 164-5 E.G.Nash took 2 of the SW League wickets to fall and Abergavenny won by 83 runs with good knocks from C.Price (32) Tommy Adams (16) and C.Bird (16)


Abergavenny 72 all out Lew White (13) E.W.Morgan (11) Pontnewynydd won by 3 wickets. Lew White taking 8 wickets as they batted on after the winning runs were scored.

Crickhowell win at their new ground

Crickhowell 72 all out. Don Wallace father of Ryland and grandfather of Mark opened the batting for Crickhowell. There were 7 wickets for Bird, 2 for E.G.Nash and 1 for Lew White. In reply Abergavenny were all out for 56 runs with W.Kemmey, L.Jones and E.G.Nash all making double figures. This was only the 2nd or 3rd fixture to be played on their new ground.

St Fagans 158-8 with 4-27 for L.White, 2-32 for Nicholls and a wicket for C.F.R.Price. Abergavenny 108 all out. L.White (14) W.Kemmey (42) E.G.Nash (28) losing comfortably.

Abergavenny v Mr W.H.Irvings X1 resulted in Abergavenny winning by 4 wickets chasing 53. H.Sadler, E.T.Bowen and W.Mayo making the runs.



Another feature of Cricket in 1947 was the provision of Colts Cricket (See Left) Mel Pritchard 4-4 G.Alderton 5-11. Trevor Rodwell who was only a 3rd Form pupil took 6-18 for Crickhowell

Abergavenny then beat Newport Athletic by 50 runs. Newport only fielded 10 men, but did include their professional spin bowler Jarrett. Tommy Adams mastered him however scoring (70) after going in first he was 9th man out.

They also beat Brecon after scoring 211-2 W.Kemmey just missing out on a century when out for (94) Brecon were all out for 73. White taking 6 wickets, for just 6 runs, S.Stock 2 wickets for 6 runs, Nash and Adams one wicket each. Next came saw Glamorgan Nomads who amassed 204 runs Stock 4-42, White 4-57 and Nichols 2-37 beating Abergavenny by 87 runs who were bowled out for 117. H.Sharpe (53) Lew White (27) Syd Stock (21) and F.G.Nichols (21)

Away at Ross there was another defeat in a low scoring game, Ross making 98 and Abergavenny 94, White scoring (29) and Roch (12)

Syd Stock bowling 11 overs 4 maidens and taking 5-26, White 3-26 and F Nichols 2-25. During this game Lew White secured his 50th wicket of the season.

Away at Builth Wells the First X1 lost, despite a fine (66) from Tommy Adams, Syd Stock also made (21) however they then defeated Carmarthen Wanderers who scored 191-8, Tommy Adams 6-42, L.White 2-27 Abergavenny getting the runs for the loss of 4 wickets. L.White (61) top scoring. This was reported as one of the best games of cricket of the season

Meanwhile the 2nd X1 were defeating Oakdale, having scored 146 themselves G.Walker (40) E.W.Morgan (26) H.Bowkett (22) the 2nd's bowled Oakdale out for 114. Bernard Hill 7-21. [Bernard Hill& H.Bowkett Pictured below]

The 2^{nd} X1 tied with Llantarnam, both Sides finishing on 116. E.W.Morgan (38) Mel Pritchard 2-12, C.Cox 2-38.

Neath Sphinx then beat Abergavenny by 65 runs. Sphinx making 142, Stock 4-38, White 3-26. In reply Abergavenny could only manage 72. Adams, Sadler, White and Kemmey all getting good starts but unable to press on.

St Fagan's inflicted a heavy defeat in the next game by 106 runs. However, Next day Abergavenny got back to winning ways beating the Mr J.F.Rust X1 by 7 wickets.

The 2^{nd} X1 82 all out did not fare any better against St Fagans 2^{nd} X1 losing by 4 wickets. G.V.Evans and G.Walker were top scorers.

Crickhowell bowled out for just 18 runs



Tommy Adams 1 run short of deserved Century

Merthyr Police were easily beaten by 10 wickets having only scored 73. Tommy Adams making (99) Sadler (33) as they batted on after passing the Police total.

More meritorious was the victory over Hereford by 30 runs. Only scoring 100 themselves H.Sadler (13) W.Mayo (29) B.Jennings (25) Hereford were bowled out for 70 runs, 6 wickets for White 3 for Adams and 1 for Jennings.

The next Day Cardiff were 104 all out, Norman Riches the well known former Glamorgan C.C.C. player was a spectator at the game. White 4-46, Stock 3-20. Abergavenny won by 5 wickets, W.Kemmey (53*) and Syd Stock (24*)

With the season drawing to a close and having enjoyed glorious summer weather, Abergavenny defeated Gloucestershire's Lydney who were bowled out for 97. Nichols 4-28, Stock 2-17, White 3-48. In reply there were runs from W.Robinson (47) and Stock (22) who ensured victory.

Unfortunately the season ended with a defeat to Usk with Stan York making 102* Abergavenny were all out for 77 H.Sadler (21) chasing 176.

Other Batting, Tommy Adams averaged 37.5 from 22 innings. Bill Kemmey the wicket keeper had an excellent season playing 28 matches, taking 52 victims 38 stumpings and 14 catches

The 2^{nd} X1 Played 13 matches, won 4 Drawn 2 and lost 7. The Batting averages for the 2^{nd} X1 were George Walker Average 17.5 Lance Jones 16 Charles Price 10 and Bernard Hill 10.
