Death of Max Beveridge announced

January 1951 the death of Alderman Max Beveridge was announced aged 61 years. Later at the AGM President Mr JK Ruther referred at the outset to the passing of Max Beveridge who was a good supporter of the club, including taking on the role of Secretary when the club was going through very grim times, by his death the club had lost one of its staunchest supporters.

Mr Raif Godfrey presented the 2nd X1 report for 1950-They played for the fun of the game and also as a nursery for the 1st X1. CJ Cox headed the batting followed by WG Powell and EG Nash. He thanked Mr Stock for enabling the team to start the season in new kit.

The season started with an away match at Panteg and a home game with Newport Fugitives.

April 22nd Newport Fugitives were all out for 117 with L.White 3-24, Stock and Alderton with 2 wickets each and T.Adams.Wynne Williams and L.Jones 1 wicket each. Abergavenny had made 142-8 S.Stock (32) L.White (19) and Garth Phillips (27) G.Alderton [11] B.Jennings [10*] with the runs.

Abergavenny 97 all out LG Jones (10) G.Alderton (14) R.Jennings (12) Noel Parry (27) Don Parry (12) whilst Abergavenny 2nd X1 scored 182-9 P.Bishop [34] C.Berrington [16] M.Powell [54*] S.Hall [12] V.Jones [23] R.Lewis [18*] and Crickhowell 92 all out with 6 wickets for C.Berrington, 3 wkts for H.Bowkett and one for V.Jones Abergavenny 2nd's then defeated Sherman's of Cardiff

May 19th Abergavenny 163-6 beat Whiteheads 86 all out. Lew White scoring (45) L.G.Jones (76) WH Sadler (24) Garth Phillips (13) and Noel Parry (5-25) and Lew White with 5 wickets.

May 26th Monmouth 141-8 Noel Parry 3-36, L.White 2-24, one wicket each for Don Parry, Alderton and Jennings drew with Abergavenny who were 20 runs short at 121-2 L.White (53*) W.Williams (37) and LG Jones (23)

June 2nd Abertillery 115 T.Adams 7-46, L.White 2-10 and G.Alderton 1-10 beat Abergavenny 81 with runs from T.Adams (22) following his 7 wicket haul, LG Jones (14) and E.Sandford (11).





August 2nd Abergavenny 142 T.Adams scoring (33) Wynne Williams (31) L.White (30) J.Hill (13) Inland Revenue (Llanishen) winning 143-9 by 1 wicket. Don Parry 4-40, T.Adams 3-42 L.White 1-18

August 4th Pontypridd 217-6 defeated Abergavenny 80 all out. L.G.Jones (34*) L.White (14) Noel Parry taking 5-50 finishing the season as a bowler with a flourish and ending up top of the averages.

On August 5th in Lew White's Benefit game Abergavenny came unstuck against Cowbridge after posting a useful 162-4 with Tommy Adams getting (67) H.Sadler (23) W.Williams (16) and L.G.Jones (29*) Cowbridge made 166-3 with White, Jennings and Alderton taking a wicket apiece.

August 6th Abergavenny 149 W.H.Sadler (27) T. Adams (22) L.G.Jones (37) L.White (12) and J.Hill (24) drew with Crickhowell 132-9 in a close finish. SH Stock 1-9, Noel Parry 2-33, Don Parry 3-26,L.White 2-14, W.Williams 1-9.

On the 9th of August another draw followed against the Birmingham Side Mayflies who made 171-7 declared. SH Stock 2-55,L.White 1-28, DR Thomas 1-18. Abergavenny in reply scoring 126-6 with L.White scoring (48) W.Williams (27) and EN Morgan (13*)

There was still time for a 9 a Side club game. 1^{st} X1 scored 226-7 with Lew White (111) L.G.Jones (56) and the 2^{nd} X1 were all out for 131.

August 19th Sphinx 211-4 One wicket each for Adams, White, Williams and Baxter beat Abergavenny 94 all out with Bob Jennings scoring (28) T.Adams (18) C.Berrington (18) W.Williams (10) & L.White (12) August 25th game v Whiteheads was abandoned for rain with Abergavenny 64-3 L.White (40*)

September 2nd Abergavenny 93 Sadler (23) W.Williams (23)R.Jennings (17)J.Hill (12) Barry 137-7 L.White 4-25 R.Jennings 1-19.

September 8th Panteg 98 SH Stock 4-31, W.Williams 3-27, L.White 2-18. Abergavenny 96 L.White (48) G.Phillips (23)

The 1st X1 record for the Season: Played 39, Won 10, Draw 8, Lost 18, with 3 matches abandoned. Lew White, Leslie Jones and Wynne Williams all averaged 20 plus. Lew White also took 60 wickets @ 12.6. Don Parry took 53 wickets @13.1 T.Adams 48 wickets at 18.1 John Hill the wicket keeper claimed 55 victims

The 2nd X1 record for the Season: Played 19, Won 11, Drawn 5, Lost 3. Their top scorer was Eddie Sandford with an average of 32. The top Bowler was J.Baxter with 32 wickets @8.75 E.Tovey the wicketkeeper took 20 catches.
