



Cricket attractions stronger than ever

Mr Syd Stock retires from Captaincy

At the AGM on March 25th in the Greyhound Hotel-Mr Roch commented on the lack of spectators, stating "We had a very strong fixture list with really good sides visiting us but the crowds didn't materialise". Mr Ruther put it down to the weather which was poor last season.

In their next match Abergavenny scored 153-8 with Bob Jennings making (46) and Les Jones (27) when rain stopped play.

April 26th BNS 147 all out Seven wickets for Sandford three for Bowkett. Abergavenny 152 all out- H.V Bowkett [22]C.Cox [15] V.Jones [53] E.Tovey [27]

Three defeats

May 17th Then Abergavenny lost to Whiteheads by 5 wickets. Abergavenny 47 all out, only T.Adams with (11) did any good with the bat. Whiteheads 51-5 W.Saunders the ex Crickhowell player taking 3 wickets. Abergavenny $2^{\rm nd}$ X1 beat Whiteheads $2^{\rm nd}$ X1 away by 22 runs- Bowkett taking 7 wkts & top scoring with [23] . Next Day May $18^{\rm th}$ -Sunday

Barry then won by 11 runs scoring 105 with W.Saunders taking 6-32. Abergavenny only totalling 94 in reply with Gerald Alderton (30) S.Stock (21*) and Lew White (10)the 2nd X1 also lost to Barry 2nd X1 who scored 109-4 wkts for Bowkett, 3 for Sandford, 2 for Jones and 1 for Pritchard. In a game against touring Weaste C.C. (Lancs) the tourists were dismissed for 17 (Seventeen). Accurate bowling and fine catching was the key. T.Adams taking 5-5 and Lew White 5-10. Abergavenny knocking off the required runs for victory but still lost 3 wickets. Afterwards in a 'knockabout' the visitors made 130-1 and Abergavenny were all out 90.

Whit Monday In the local derby with Crickhowell who scored 87 with 4 wickets for Adams and Prosser and 2 for Lew White. Abergavenny were heading for victory at 59-2 when rain stopped play. Les Jones scored (27) and Tommy Adams (21)

A defeat to Hereford who scored 136, with 4 wickets for L.White and 2 each for Williams and Stock. Abergavenny 123 W.Williams (26) L.White (22) G.Alderton (17) getting runs

St Fagans scored 193-4 Abergavenny losing again with only 90 all out. Meanwhile Abergavenny's 2nd X1 were defeated by both St Fagans and Hereford. St Fagans 2nd X1 172-8 4 wkts for M.Pritchard and 3 wkts for H.Bowkett. Abergavenny 2nd X1 136-7 B.Jennings [55] C.Price and E.Sandford each scored [23]& P.Jones [20*] Hereford 2nd X1 104 all out-6 wkts for M.Pritchard, 1 wkt for Price and two for L.Jones. Abergavenny 2nd X1 -72 all out only two with double figures G.Evans[18] W Barnes [12]

Monmouth 141-8. The feature of the match was the fact that Syd Stock used nine bowlers. Abergavenny came near to victory but had to settle for a draw.

At Monmouth Abergavenny 223-6 declared L.White (67) H.Sadler (32) the younger players did well Berrington with [26] while both Parry and Alderton reached double figures. Monmouth 62 Don Prosser 4-40, Parry 3-13, Williams 3-4.

Blazers awarded to Parry and Pritchard

Don Parry was awarded a Blazer at the Annual Dinner for his batting which saw him averaging 24 runs for the Season. Most impressive of his performances was his 85 runs against Neath when Abergavenny were in real trouble. Another Blazer was awarded to Mel Pritchard who took 48 wickets at an average of 9.5

In the AGM Lew White the vice captain was praised for scoring the most runs taking the most wickets and holding the most catches
