
### 1959 Season

Malcolm Cox joined the Club this season and was seen as an admirable replacement for Randall Bellis. Another newcomer was Geoff Richardson who it was hoped would be an adequate replacement for Nasir Ali. Ossie Griffiths also joined the Club The traditional warm up game against Cardiff Choristers was held in May. Abergavenny fielded a weakened side and the match was rain affected, Abergavenny were bowled out for 99. M.Cox and O.Griffiths signing on with (22) and (10) respectively Skipper Lew White who had a really lean season in 1958 scored (12) but Cardiff ran out easy winners at 100-3, with Jennings and Price taking one wicket apeice.

May 2<sup>nd</sup> Pontymister 152-7 declared Bob Jennings 3-42, Saunders and Hayward had 1 wicket each. Abergavenny 153-7 Geoff Richardson a newcomer to the Club in 1959 scored (73) and that old stalwart Lew White (44) A draw with Ross on May 3<sup>rd</sup> who were 116-7 declared, Abergavenny held on at 86-5

At the same time Abergavenny 2<sup>nd</sup> X1 comprehensively defeated Ross 2<sup>nd</sup> X1 Abergavenny 2nds 183-2 declared with Bill McPherson making his career best score (83) Mike Stock (38) and D.Fennell (46\*) Fennel then turned 'demon' with the ball taking 8 Ross wickets in their total of 110 all out. B.MacPherson taking one wicket.

In reply Abergavenny Grammar School pupil Jeremy Price last season's 'Prince of Swipe' scored (54\*) to add to his 3-40 well supported by Colin Nash [13] Lew White [17] E.Hughes [11] and Tony Paton (21)

May 18th Lydney beat Abergavenny by 42 runs. Lydney 133 all out, 5 wickets for McPherson, 2 for Price and one each for Richardson & Hayward. Abergavenny managed 91 all out with only Colin Nash [17], Geoff Richardson [20] and Lew White [28] scoring any runs of note.

On May 23<sup>rd</sup> Newport were bowled out for 127 with 5 wickets for Hodson, 4 wickets for Richardson and one for Bob Jennings, however Abergavenny completely capitulated and were bowled out for 31 in 1 hour 10 minutes, Bob Jennings top scored with [10]



July  $18^{th}$  Abergavenny 117 all out E.Hughes (27) G.Richardson (20) C.Berrington (25) lost by 2 wickets to Cardiff HSOB 120-8 Jennings , Richardson and Hayward (2 wickets each) crucially Lew White dropped a catch on the boundary, which also went for 4 runs.

July 19<sup>th</sup> Ross 142 all out, Hayward and White (4 wkts) each, Price (2 wkts) Drew with Abergavenny 138-7 P.Jones (25) Malcolm Cox (33) Malcolm Cox joined the club this season and looks a more than able replacement for Randall Bellis, R.Jennings (27\*) C.Nash (18)
