This was followed by another draw with Cardiff Choristers who made 46-4 in reply to Abergavenny's 120 all out J.Powell (24) C.Nash (64) M.Farr (11). There was one wicket each for Farr, Shackleton, Griffiths and Jennings.

Abergavenny 78 all out, P.Jones (21) beat Newport Fugitives who were all out for 49 with Mike Farr taking 7-21. Malcolm Nash on loan to Fugitives scored (19) of their 49. Chepstow in another home game were all out for a mere 27. M.Farr 5-7 and M.Nash 2-9..

This was followed by the first away game at Abertillery, which was affected by rain.

May 9^{th} saw the First X1 98-9 B.Shackleton (16) A.Letherington (14*) and L.White (13) v the Second X1 46 all out. The First X1 winning by 42 runs, promise in this trial match was shown by Mike Roberts, fast bowler Mike Walters and Ralph Dowdeswell for the 1st X1 and by Tony Garnet-Jones for the 2nd X1.

A win against Llanelly Wanderers who only made 39 all out. M.Nash 5-19 and M.Farr 4-8. Abergavenny 40-3, J.Powell (17) and G.Richardson (12)

A defeat at the hands of Semtex, for whom Brian Aubrey scored (42) of their 153 all out. Abergavenny 71 all out with only Mike Stock (22) scoring any runs.

Mumbles 51 all out M.Farr 5-13, M.Nash 3-9 and Bob Jennings 2-8 were beaten, chasing Abergavenny's 123 all out, with (58) from M.Nash.

Lydney 61 all out, Bill McPherson 5-25, M.Nash 2-8, M.Farr 3-12. Abergavenny 62-3 with Richardson and White with the runs.

Lovells were 56 all out with Ossie Griffiths taking 4 wickets. This after Abergavenny were bowled out for 141. J.Powell (39) M.Nash (23) G.Richardson (16) and M.Roberts (19)

Kodak X1 155 all out4 wickets for B.Jennings, 3 wickets for O.Griffiths and 2 wickets for M.Nash. Abergavenny held on at 103-7 with G.Richardson (18) and Colin Hanbury (19*)

Newport Fugitives were beaten. They made 142-9 declared 2 wickets each for M.Nash and O.Griffiths and 3 wickets for B.Jennings. Abergavenny 143-9,

G.Richardson (24) J.Powell (50) and L.Isherwood (22)

A good win followed against Lydney who were bowled out for 111. Mike Farr taking 4-29 and W.McPherson also with 4 wickets. Abergavenny reaching the required total for the loss of 8 wickets. Runs from M.Powell (28) and Lew White (40)

Crickhowell 116 with all the Abergavenny bowlers chipping in with wickets proved too good for Abergavenny who were all out for 110, M.Nash (26) and M.Powell (38*)

The 2nd X1 in 1964 won eight of their fixtures, they beat Pontllanfraith by 4 runs, after being bowled out for 84 runs they dismissed Pontllanfraith for 80. They also beat Hereford who were bowlwd out for 74, Abergavenny 2nd's reaching their goal for the loss of 8 wickets. Newport Fugitives only made 61 all out chasing Abergavenny's score of 155 for 7. It was a bit closer against Abertillery who made 138-7 with Abergavenny scraping home at 141-7. Coleford were dismissed for a dismal 22 runs and Abergavenny sauntered to victory at 22-2. Another low scored of 39 was achieved by HWF, but Abergavenny lost 8 wickets chasing this small target, 40-8. The other two victories over Caerleon and Ewas Harold were low scoring games as well Caerleon 53, Abergavenny 54-4. Ewas Harold 55, Abergavenny 56-6. They lost 13 matches twice to Cardiff HSOB's and Lydney then to Panteg, twice to Ross, then to Crickhowell, Brecon, twice to Usk, then to Hereford and Whiteheads.

They managed 5 draws some of which could have gone Abergavenny's way. Whiteheads, Abercarn twice, Crickhowell and Chepstow.
