April  $22^{nd}$  The standing 'dish' for Abergavenny's start to the season, Thornbury, were beaten in a low scoring game. Abergavenny 105 all out. Peter Thomas and Brian Shackleton were top scorers.

Thornbury were 84 all out with Keith Watkins 4-13 and S.Lennox 3-26. The game which was slipping away from Abergavenny turned however following a superb run out by B.Shackleton from thirty yards.

April 21<sup>st</sup> Another low scoring game followed against Bitton (Bristol) who bowled Abergavenny out for 79, only D.Jones (23) made any sort of score. However they were only to be bowled out themselves for 34 with D.Jones and S.Lennox taking 5 wickets each.

A third pre-season friendly against Mumbles away saw Abergavenny reach 135-4 M.Powell (56) D.Jones (43) 7 and D.Brown (20\*) Mumbles were all out for 84 with D.Jones 5-35. Another standing 'dish' the weather contrived to spoil some cricket for a while and Abergavenny got going again against Caerleon (h) on May 13<sup>th</sup> scoring 200-3 with G.Haggerty (57) L.Wilcock (81) D.Griffin (31\*) In reply Caerleon were 77-8 at the close with G.Haggerty 3-27 K.Watkins 3-5. G.Haggerty is not well known as an Abergavenny player and it can be assumed it was someone who was on the 'sick' and could not be named.

May 27<sup>th</sup> A draw against a strong Worcester side who had scored 128 all out with K.Watkins taking 6-36 and D.Jones 2-38. Abergavenny holding on a 98-7.

May 28<sup>th</sup> Bristol Flaxbourton were beaten, they scored 146-9 Declared, D.Jones 3-44 and M.Drake 4-16 Abergavenny with A.Mills (44\*) and Dick Brown (37) winning by 5 wickets. May 29<sup>th</sup> A good win against Lydney after being bowled out for 139 D.Jones (49) R.Brown (35) Abergavenny bowled out Lydney for 110 K.Watkins 2-17, S.Lennox 4-28 and D.Jones 4-39.

June  $3^{rd}$  A losing draw against Winget (a)who scored 166-8 with D.Jones taking 6-42 Abergavenny making 117-9.

June 4<sup>th</sup> Hereford (h) 162 for 2. P.Sussex and K.Watkins taking 1 wicket each, were victorious chasing 162 to win after Abergavenny finished on 161-1 with D.Jones (98\*) & D.Griffin (43\*)

### **Ton for Mike Powell**

A good win against Enville who made 194-3 which was not enough as Abergavenny secured victory for the loss of 3 wickets with a magnificent century from M.Powell (103\*) & D.Jones scoring (72)

June 11<sup>th</sup> at home Abergavenny 149 all out D.Jones (48) and A.Mills John Powell [19] M.Powell [12]Kyle Holme [11] (33) Ross 136 all out P.Sussex 2-30. Also two wkts each for Watkins. Harries and Jones.

June 10<sup>th</sup> A draw with Panteg (h) who made 171-5 Denis Harries taking 4-72 in reply to Abergavenny's 189-6 D.Jones (63) M.Powell (51) and K.Holmes (42).

June 17<sup>th</sup> Pontnewynydd (h) were beaten by 8 wickets, Pontnewynydd 154-7, Abergavenny 158-2 M.Powell (78\*) and L.Wilcock (60) A draw with Gloucester City who scored 171-7, in reply Abergavenny were 140-5 P.Sussex (23\*) R.Rossiter (28)

In the Monmouthshire Knock Out 20 over competition Chepstow were beaten ensuring a quarterfinal tie against Malpas. Malpas 107 all out two wickets for k.Watkins, three for K.Holmes and one for P.Sussex. Abergavenny getting the runs for the loss of four wickets M.Powell [23] D.Jones [58]L.Wilcock [7] K.Holmes [9\*]D.Griffin [4\*]

On Saturday July 8<sup>th</sup> the 1<sup>st</sup> X1 visited Dursley CC and scored 167-7 M.Powell (66) K.Holmes (14) R.Rossiter (20) S.Lennox (15) J.Powell (18) Dursley 132-7 with wickets for N.Martin 3-55 K.Watkins 4-21.

On the Sunday Back in the TCL Colwall (h) were defeated, Abergavenny scoring 182-7 K.Holmes (47) D.Jones (27) M.Powell (21) John Powell (24) and D.Griffin (46) Colwall were all out for 173 K.Watkins taking 5-62, Two wickets for S.Lennox and one for Paul Sussex.

July 16<sup>th</sup> at Avenue Road Usk's score of 206-5 S.Lennox 2-69, D.Jones 2-66 was almost overhauled as Abergavenny finished on 202-7 M.Powell (70) K.Holmes (47) Andy Mills (39)D.Jones (24). July 15<sup>th</sup> A relatively bloodless victory came next against Newport Fugitives (a) who were bowled out for 156, K.Watkins 5-59 and N.Martin 3-23. M.Drake 2-29 David Griffin scored (77\*) M.Powell (24) D.Jones (23) K.Holmes)10) as Abergavenny won by 3 wickets.

An exciting quarter final of the Mon KO Cup against Malpas ended with Abergavenny winning with 2 balls to spare chasing 107 D.Griffin with (58) the hero and M.Powell with (23). K.Watkins 2-19 K.Holmes 3-15 Caerleon would be the semi-final opposition.

July 29<sup>th</sup> A poor game against Cirencester who only managed 147-6 K.Watkins 3-50 and young David Dver 2-30. Saw Abergavenny reach 100-7.

On August 6<sup>th</sup> A big improvement came against Usk when after scoring 193-5 with D.Jones (66) and D.Griffin (63) getting the bulk of the runs. Usk were all out for 66 with D.Jones taking 4-26 and P.Sussex 3-11.

## Abergavenny win Monmouthshire KO Cup

Abergavenny having beaten Caerleon in the semi-final went on to defeat Panteg in the Final at Usk. This was the 2<sup>nd</sup> time in the last four years Abergavenny had been in the final and the other 2 years they were in the Semi Finals.

In the semi final against Caerleon David Jones bowled 5 overs 4-10, Keith Watkins 5 overs 2-10 Paul Sussex 5 overs 0-7. In the Final Abergavenny scored 101-7 and Panteg only managed 90-9 in reply

A winning draw against Colwall on August 13<sup>th</sup> and a victory over Winget the day before followed. Abergavenny 149-8, Colwall 120-9. Winget 165-8 with Abergavenny getting them for the loss of 6 wickets.

### **Another 'ton' for Mike Powell**

August 19<sup>th</sup> The Gwent Premier League was sewn up with the demolishing of Whiteheads who scored 85-6 in reply to Abergavenny's 216-4 M.Powell (116) with another century and D.Griffin (48). Ross brought Abergavenny down to earth with a win, chasing Abergavenny's 161 all out R.Brown (58) K.Holmes (39) they reached their target for 5 wickets with P.Sussex taking 3-46.

Neath away saw a close draw Abergavenny 164-7 D.Jones (85\*) two runs short of Neath 165-7 P.Sussex 4-38. August 26<sup>th</sup> Abergavenny 123-8 D.Griffin (59) Tewkesbury 99-10 S.Lennox 5-51 and P.Sussex 2-17. Revenge came against Ross who scored 138-9 Abergavenny winning by 2 wickets D.Jones (63) and M.Powell (34).

### 3rd Century for Mike Powell





### **Dennis Harries**

Abergavenny Cricket Club pace bowler Denis 'Dinky' Harries (Above) collapsed and died during a match against Monmouth on Saturday, July 1st 1978. He was 35 years old. He had just completed his 14th over, having taken five Monmouth wickets for 24 runs. A Doctor living nearby the club's Avenue Road ground gave the player the kiss of life, but Mr Harries was dead on arrival at Nevill Hall Hospital. 'Dinky' joined the Club from Tredegar five years ago. He quickly established himself as a favourite at the Club In his first four years he took over 300 wickets, last year 1977 was his best ever with a bag of 96 wickets. He was also a keen rugby player and played regularly for Brynmawr RFC. He was also a member of the General Committee of Tredegar RFC and lived with his mother and sister in Poachin Crescent Tredegar. A Quality Controller at BSC Tinplate works at Ebbw Vale 'Dinky' was very well known in Gwent and Three Counties League cricketing circles. The day before his death he had returned from a weeks cricket tour in Kent with Abergavenny C C. A spokesman for the club said "Dinky's death has been a tremendous shock to all members of the Club. He will be sadly missed, not only by us, but by cricketers throughout the County."

# ABERGAVENNY CRICKET CLUB'S FIRST COUNTY CRICKETER

Malcolm Nash was born and bred in Abergavenny and the Abergavenny Club takes great pride in staging this match in aid of his benefit. Mr. Ted Nash, Malcolm's father, is the popular and enthusiastic President of the Club and his brother Colin played for Abergavenny with distinction for many years before leaving the area to play for Hornsey in North London. In contrast to most of the Welshmen on the Glamorgan staff, Malcolm did not develop in the Glamorgan coaching nursery, joining them directly from club cricket with Abergavenny in 1966.

As a youngster, Malcolm and his elder brother Colin were coached by the great Somerset batsman Harold Gimblett and his Somerset colleague Bill Andrews, who were, in turn, club professionals with Ebbw Vale Cricket Club. In school, at Wells Cathedral School, another Somerset player, Alan Whitehead, now a first-class umpire, was responsible for his coaching. However, much of his progress was made under the watchful eyes of Lewis White, club coach and Captain of Abergavenny, aided, of course, by brother Colin.

Malcolm played his first match for Abergavenny at age of 10, but first stamped his mark in 1959 at the age of fifteen, being called upon when the 1st XI were one short on a visit to their great friends and rivals, Panteg C.C., one of the strongest sides in the area. This proved to be a sensational debut, as Malcolm saved Abergavenny from disaster with a superb innings of 61. From that day, Abergavenny knew that they had a player of considerable potential and both Malcolm and his brother Colin were to make vast contributions to the success of Abergavenny Cricket Club in the following six seasons.

However, although undoubtedly a genuine all rounder from the start of his playing days, it was principally as a batsman that Malcolm made his reputation in cricket at club level. His powerful stroke-play brought him many a century for the club and he frequently bowled his side to victory both with seam and spin. His best bowling performance was, without question, against Lydney on Whitsun Bank Holiday Monday in 1965, when he took all ten Lydney wickets for 29. It was this outstanding season in 1965, when he completed the double of 100 wickets and 1,000 runs, which brought Malcolm to the notice of several counties, including, of course, Glamorgan. He was offered a trial and, grasping the opportunity with both hands, he became a contracted Glamorgan player in 1967.

Everyone in Abergavenny Cricket Club has followed Malcolm's professional career with the greatest of interest and pleasure. He has added an extra dimension to the interest of Abergavenny people in Glamorgan cricket and, whenever he produces a notable performance, the news is swiftly relayed throughout the club. He has never forgotten his allegiance to Abergavenny Cricket Club and has always been willing and anxious to have the occasional game whenever possible.

It gives our club the greatest of pleasure to have the opportunity of hosting our very good friends, the Glamorgan and Warwickshire teams. It is most fitting that the highly entertaining and friendly cricketers from Edgbaston will be gracing us with their cheerful presence, once again, especially as Alvin Kallicharran has captained the West Indies Test Team, since he last visited us. May we join Malcolm in thanking them for contributing to the success of this unique occasion in the history of Abergavenny Cricket Club. The club is also most grateful to the advertisers, who have contributed to the printing of this programme.

We all feel very sad that our former Chairmen, Peter Jones, Bill Macpherson and Dennis Harries, all of whom tragically passed away within the past twelve months, will not be with us this year. Their vast contribution to previous benefit matches will be sadly missed.

The members of Abergavenny Cricket Club wish Malcolm every success in this, his benefit year, and may he continue his great success on the cricket field in the years ahead. May the weather be kind to everybody on the day and let the people of Abergavenny express their gratitude for the pleasure that he has given by turning out in force to support him.



The Official Opening of the Bill McPherson Scorebox


