
June 29th - Hatherley (a) 159 all out were defeated Abergavenny 161-6 M.Bloor (42)


The next day they batted on and the match ended in a draw as they finished the day on 309-6.

World Events

Thirty-nine people are killed at the Heysel stadium in Brussels, Belgium. The Soviet pole vaulter Sergey Bubka makes the first ever 6-m/19.7-ft jump, in Paris, France. Europe's golfers, captained by the English golfer Tony Jacklin, defeat the USA 16.5–11.5 in the Ryder Cup at The Belfry, Sutton Coldfield in England. It is the first time the USA has lost the trophy since 1957. Larry Holmes of the USA loses his Title to Leon Spinks It is Holmes's first defeat in 48 professional fights, 22 of which were world title bouts. Orson Welles, US film actor, director, producer, and writer, best known for Citizen Kane, dies in Los Angeles, California (70) US firm Microsoft develops Windows for the IBM PC. The British pop group Dire Straits releases the album Brothers in Arms. It becomes the first CD to sell 1 million copies.
