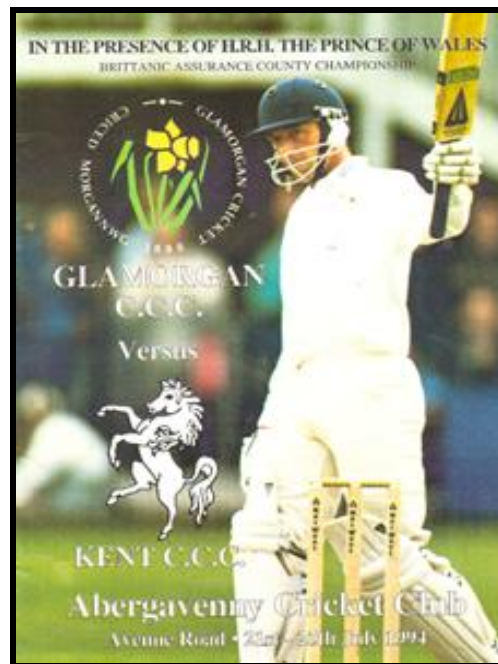


1994- 4 Day County Championship Game v Kent CCC

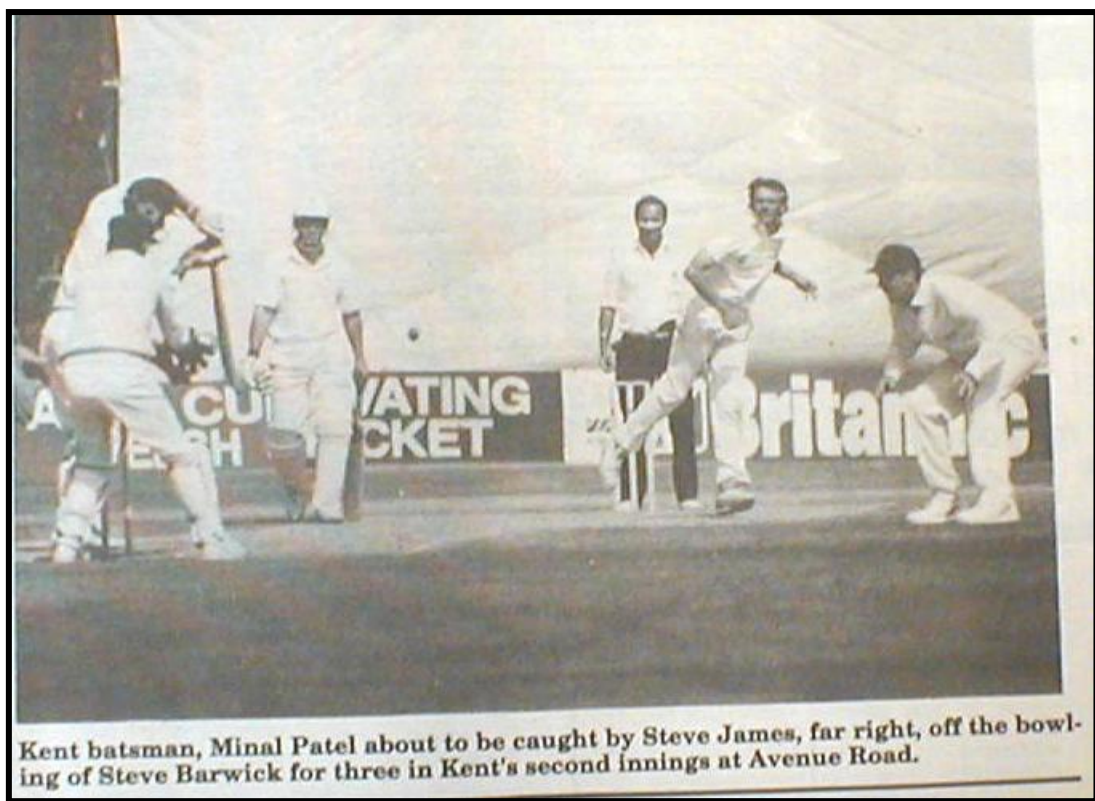


Glamorgan v Kent

The temporary stand (pictured above) provided by Robert Price was still in place as Ross were the visitors to Avenue Road.

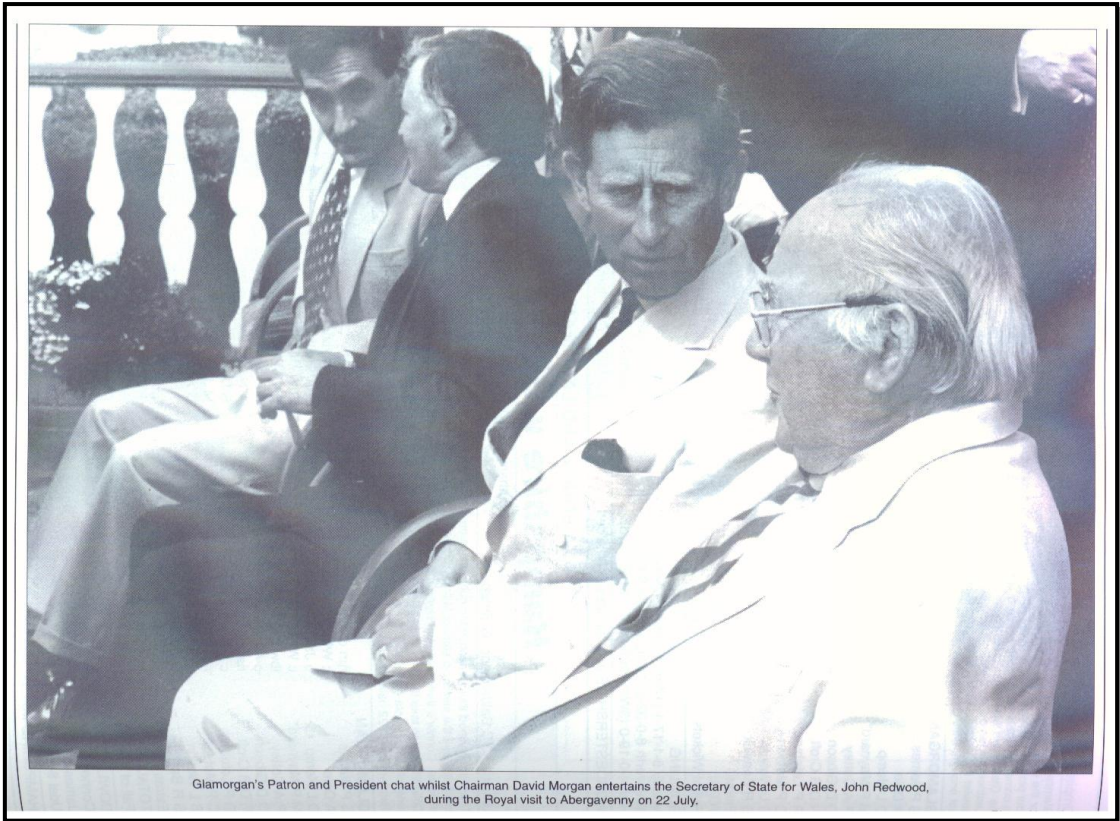

Len Smith describes the ground at Abergavenny as a favourite of his.

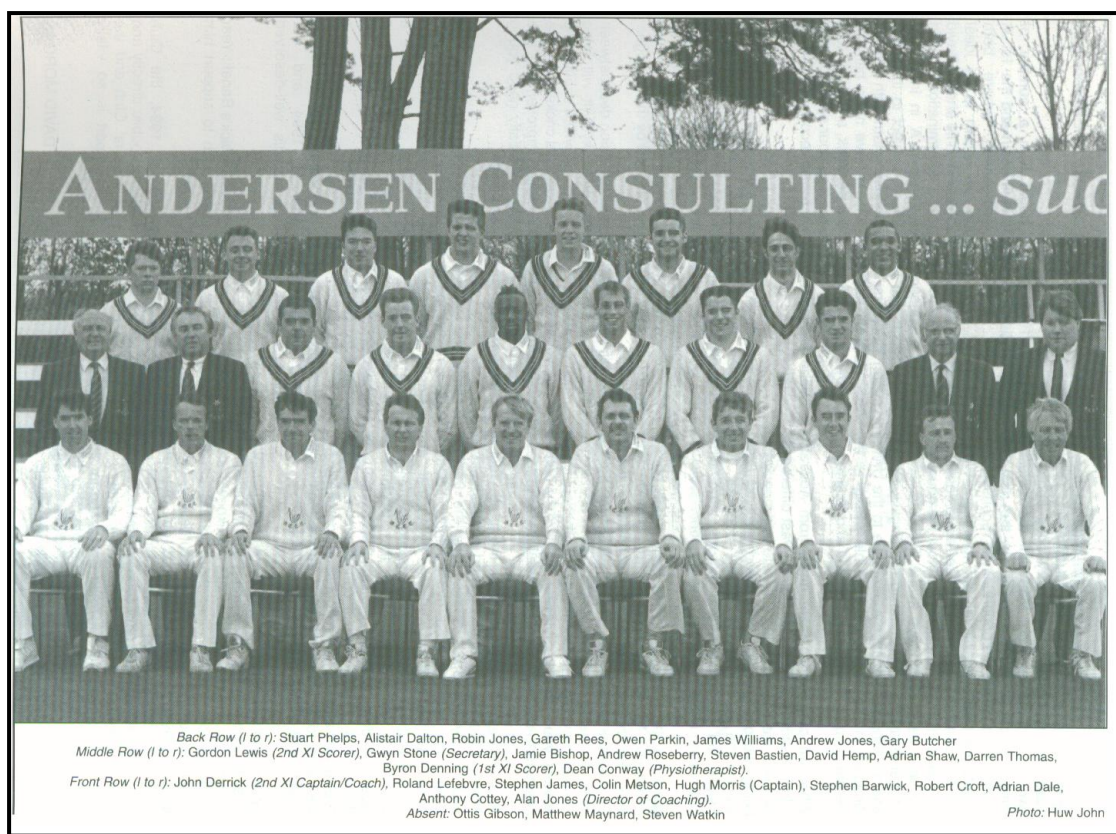
