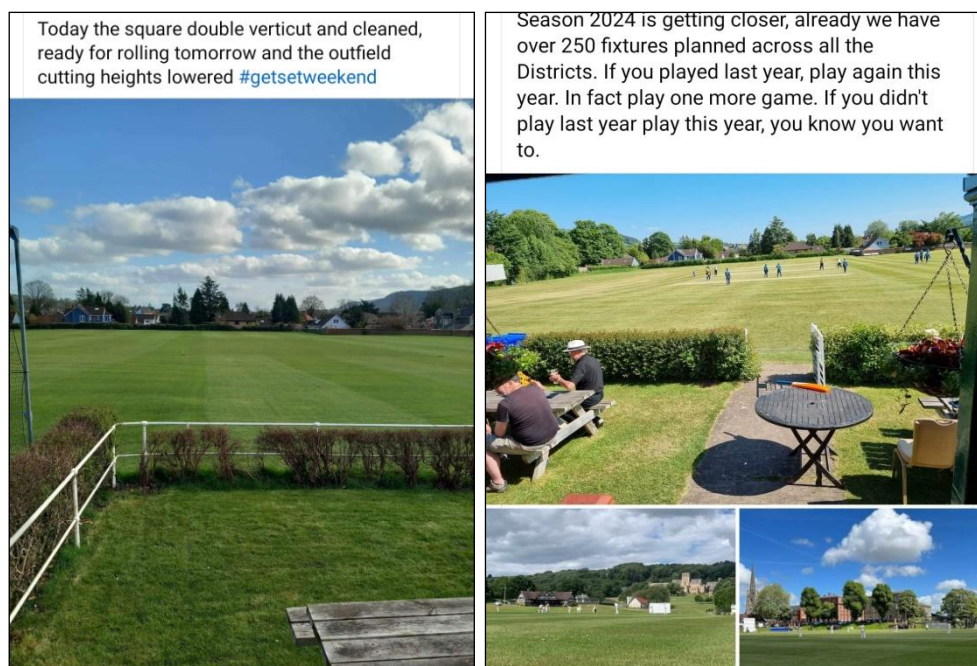

The new Club Chairman Geoff Shackleton following in his late father Brian Shackleton footsteps along with the new Club Captain Sam Clarke are looking forward to the new season under their leadership. Following winning Division 1 of the South East Wales Cricket League Abergavenny Cricket Club First X1 look forward to the 2024 season in the South Wales Premier League Division 2 the 2nd tier of Welsh Cricket. As well as the nucleus of the promotion winning side Abergavenny welcome an overseas player once again in the shape of Daniel Skipwith a pupil of Brisbane State High School, fresh from an outstanding performance at the 2023 Cricket Australia National Championships. Representing Queensland in the Under 17 Male team, as they brought home the championship trophy after an impressive victory against NSW Metro. This led to Daniel being selected for the U19 Queensland Cricket team. Abergavenny have a rich history of attracting Brisbane based cricketers since 1996

when they hired Brad Murphy as Coach he enjoyed 3 seasons with the club and recommended the Likes of Ross Lupton, Andrew Robinson, Alan Free, Darren Holder. If Daniel who is currently in Sri Lanka with Queensland Academy lives up to Brads assessment he will do fine. Other newcomers are Ryan Avery who joins us from Croesyceiliog CC and Karl Leathley from Helston, Cornwall an opening bat who actually played for the Cornwall National County Team against Wales NC at Avenue Road back in August of 2023

Abergavenny will again field 4 senior Teams with the 2nd X1 playing in SEWCL Division 6, the 3rd X1 in Division 10 and the 4th X1 in Division 12 E. With the Clubs commitment to developing cricketers the club will again offer cricket for the following age groups

Abergavenny played their first friendly of the new season on Saturday a 40 over game v Llandaff CC. On winning the toss Abergavenny inserted Llandaff who not surprisingly found batting difficult after a reasonable start and they went from 47 -0 to 116-6 after 26 overs. Those 26 overs were shared by 8 different bowlers including two of the new recruits Dan Skipwith and Ryan Avery. Llandaff were eventually all out for 186. There were 2 wickets each for Dan Skipwith, George Martin St-Valery yet another debutante, Geraint Leach and Marc Morgan and one each for Dylan Beaumont-Welsh and Toby Smith. Ryan Avery and Greg Fury put on 52 for the first wicket in just 7 overs. Avery went on to make a classy 49 before he was 3rd out to a brilliant catch with the score on 93-3. Dan Skipwith was watchful on his debut with conditions the polar opposite to what he faces in Queensland, however he went past his maiden half century with 3 fours and 2 sixes. Geraint Leach (16*) back with Abergavenny after a break proved a valuable support to Dan Skipwith (74*) as they saw the team home with 2 overs to spare 194-4

The visitors were Gorseinon CC and once again the visitors were asked to bat first which saw huge rewards for the Abergavenny bowlers as Gorseinon slipped to 17-3 after 7 overs with two wickets for David Clarke and one for Owen Harris. Gorseinon steadied the ship and the 4th wicket partnership took them to 65-3 at the halfway stage. Christopher Mee and keeper Greg Fisher (44) kept going and extended the partnership to 70 before Mee (42) was out. Ellis Jones then took two wickets in three balls and Gorseinon moved to 127-6 with 8 overs remaining. David Clarke in his second spell emulated Ellis Jones (2-37) with wickets with consecutive balls in the 39th over to finish with 4-18. Snell took the 9th wicket Owen Harris and Will Glenn had one wicket each and Gorseinon finished on 171-9. A slow start in reply with just 16 runs from the first 8 overs Yet another Debutante Karl Wheatley (11) a Cornishman opened with Will Eccles but he was out in the next over 16-1, that became 18-2 when Dan Skipwith was out. Batters couldn't get on top of the Gorseinon attack and after 21 overs Abergavenny were 73-5. Youngsters Jack Ryan and Olly Jones came together to try and stop the rot. They saw the 100 up together but Jack Ryan then fell for a well made (37) from just 32 balls 106-6. This brought the experienced Will Glenn to the crease with 56 runs needed from the final 10 overs, but he was the 7th wicket to fall with 43 runs still required. With 5 overs to go Abergavenny reached 150 could the Jones boys see them home? Olly and Ellis. They certainly could, passing the Gorseinon total with 2 overs to spare and 3 wickets in hand 172-7 Olly Jones (34*) and Ellis Jones (23*) for a match winning partnership of 44 runs

The tree planting in his memory (see photograph attached) was attended by family and close friends and the Celebration of his life saw many of his friends from Cricket, Golf and

Penyfal in attendance and a number of tributes were made including a video message from Brad and Kate Murphy who lodged with Ray back in 1997 . Ray served on the Committee of Abergavenny Cricket Club for many years and acted as Vice Chairman from 2003-2006. He was elected a Vice President in 2006 and later, in 2010 elevated to a Life Member. Not surprisingly, he was voted 'Clubman of the Year' on two occasions, in 1997 and 2001. Over the decades no one was a more vociferous supporter of the club's teams than Ray whether they were doing well or not so well. Unfortunately, due to his health he was only able to follow the teams during last season remotely with regular updates from his many pals. He was always at the end of the phone ready for updates. No one was more delighted than Ray to see the First XI reach Premier League Division 2 status and he gained great satisfaction in the successes of some of the club's junior cricketers. May he RIP

In the 190th year of existence Abergavenny CC travelled to the Athletic ground, Cowbridge to commence their League campaign in the 2nd tier of Welsh club cricket and now a decade away from their bicentennial the ambition is to make it to the Premier Division 1 as soon as they can.

It turned out to be the only fixture played in the Premier 2 Division it was also played in brilliant sunshine. Sam Clarke won the toss and put Cowbridge in on a low slow wicket they went quite hard early on and at one point after 25 overs were 136-2 aided by some loose bowling , when wicket to wicket was the order of the day. However the three spinners led by skipper Sam Clarke (3-43) with Owen Harries (1-46) and Dan Skipwith (1-34) tightened the screw helped by some magnificent catching and fielding including a direct hit for a run out by veteran Andrew Jones and eventually Cowbridge were all out in the 44th over for 179. The other wicket takers were Ryan Avery 1 wkt, Pawan (2-25) and David Clarke 1 wkt

Abergavenny had to contend with a more accurate attack and openers Andrew Jones and Karl Leathley found it hard to really time the ball, but they fought hard and both scored 26 runs, but in contrast to Cowbridge after 25 overs Abergavenny were 67-3. When Dan Skipwith (14) fell it was 83-4. A magnificent partnership then took place with Tom Pipe (38) and Jack Ryan (33) batting really well and increasing the tempo they put on 64 for the 5th wicket with the score at 147-5, there followed a two more wickets with the next two balls giving Salman Saeed a hat trick 147-7 which became 173-8 as Owen Harris (23*) despite being hit by a beamer guiding Abergavenny home for a crucial victory with 2 wickets and 3 overs to spare. A very satisfying outcome in their first venture at this level, leaving them to ponder on some of the improvements that will be required as they move through the season. 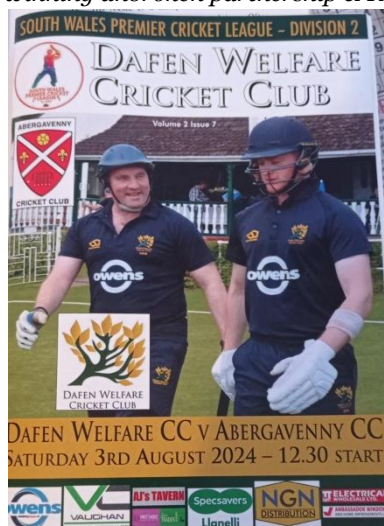

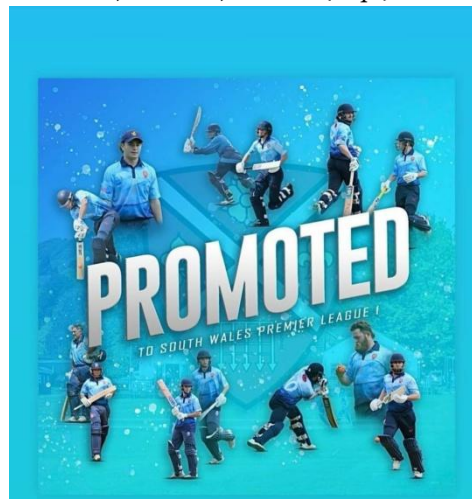
