Abergavenny Cricket Club is delighted to announce the signing of Mujahid Ilyas as player-coach for the next three years. Twenty-five years old, he has accumulated a wealth of cricketing and coaching experience in a relatively short period of time.

A right-hand bat and leg break bowler, he is a former member of the Glamorgan Academy and represented Wales at 14s, 15s and 17s level and Wales Minor Counties. He has also played for Glamorgan 2nd XI.

At club level, Muji has played for both Cardiff, St. Fagans and Newport at Premier League I, the highest standard in Wales, for several seasons. He is thus a significant addition to Abergavenny's 1st XI strength and brings much needed experience and knowledge to a very young squad.

Muji has serious coaching ambitions. He is currently a level 2 coach and is keen to move on in terms of qualifications. At present, he works in the various Glamorgan Pathways and focuses on the counties under 13 squad. He has already started his work at Abergavenny by coaching the club's 11s, 13s and 15s squads, boys and girls, in hourly sessions each Monday evenings which will continue throughout the winter.

Head of Abergavenny Cricket, Gary Thomas, has expressed himself thrilled at Muji's signing. 'We have acquired the services of a fine player and an enthusiastic high-quality coach, who will lead the development of our junior and senior players, both male and female in group sessions and on a 1:1 basis. We are very excited to have Muji on board now and he will shape our junior coaching framework over the next 3 years'.

Abergavenny Cricket Club is very saddened to learn of former player and coach Alan Dawkins, who passed away last week after a lengthy illness.

Alan was born and brought up in Crickhowell and in later life returned to the town as head of boys' PE when the High School opened in 1983. He remained there until retirement in 2014, having also taken on senior leadership positions by that time. He and his wife left the area in recent years to live in Gloucestershire.

Alan played, organised and coached all sorts of sports but cricket was his great passion. He was manager and coach of the Wales Under 14s national cricket team for many years. He played his cricket locally for the Crickhowell and Abergavenny Clubs and coached at both. In this respect, he made a considerable contribution to the development of young cricketers in the area who attended Crickhowell High School, many of whom gravitated to Avenue Road. In his era, the school became a conveyor belt of cricketing talent, many of whom earned county

and national honours. There really are too many names to contemplate listing. All have caused to remember Alun with grateful thanks and great affection.

We, at Abergavenny and Crickhowell, mourn the loss of a friend, past player and thoroughly good man. Our deepest sympathies go out his wife, Sally (who was scorer for Abergavenny 1st XI for some years), son Owen (who was very fine player for the club and has gone on to forge a successful career as a county cricket coach) and to all the rest of his family

War Memorial Plaque

Abergavenny Cricket Club has commemorated the most recent Remembrance Day anniversary by displaying a specially commissioned plaque in memory of those members of the club who lost their lives in the wars since 1914.

The club, it appears, has never been formally represented at the ceremony and it was felt by committee, members and supporters that – as a major sporting organisation in the town and district – than this should be rectified.

The plaque is a very attractive piece of craftsmanship – cast in bronze with raised lettering – and will be permanently located in the clubhouse. In subsequent years, a prominent member of the cricket club will place a wreath at the Cenotaph on each Remembrance Sunday. The plaque reads thus

about cricket from childhood, while his youngest brother, John, preferred spectating and still closely follows the game from afar, having been resident in Singapore for many years.

‘Rookie’ Glamorgan Contract for Tom Norton

Abergavenny Cricket Club is delighted with the announcement that home-grown talent Tom Norton has been added to the Glamorgan County Cricket Club first team squad on a two-year rookie deal, his first professional contract.

Tom recalls his cricketing upbringing thus: ‘I started playing at the Abergavenny club when I was six-year-old, being coached and playing in its youth structure. I got selected for the Wales Under-11 squad when I was nine and have been part of the Glamorgan Pathway and Academy system since the age of 11. I made my Abergavenny 1st XI debut at the age of 14 and my first appearance for Glamorgan 2nd XI debut the following year.

Glamorgan second XI head coach Mark O’Leary describes Tom as ‘a genuine all-rounder, a great fielder, and a big personality in the changing room. He’s a very exciting talent who thrived on that first XI experience last summer. It was a big step for him, and he grabbed it with both hands, and I think he has got a really big future ahead of him’.

Norton was part of Glamorgan’s Metro Bank One-Day Cup squads in both 2024 and 2025 and made his first XI debut against Leicestershire at Sophia Gardens in August last year, producing an impressive all-round performance with the ball and in the field. His senior debut followed an outstanding season with Glamorgan’s second XI, alongside a title-winning summer with the club’s Under-18s (of which he was captain).



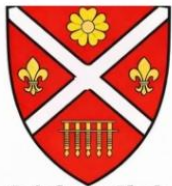

Usk on winning the toss elected to bat. Usk Openers C.Hemp and H.Caldicott started solidly against Abergavenny's opening attack. Sam Clarke replaced Spies and had an instant impact claiming the wicket of Caldicott with his 5th delivery-35-1. After 10 overs Usk were 42-1. Glamorgan's Will Smale joined Hemp and played positively whilst Hemp dug in. Mujeid Ilyas was introduced in the 20th over replacing Harris. Hemp started to be more positive as the 2nd wicket partnership passed 50. After 20 overs Usk were 95-1. Will Smale passed his half century off 34 balls ruining Clarkes figures at the same time. The return of Josh Spies didn't curb Smale who took 13 runs off his comeback over. In the next over he brought up the 100 partnership for the 2nd wicket. At the halfway stage Usk were 141-1. Just after drinks Sam Clarke coming back on to bowl claimed the danger man Smale (71) a couple of overs later he clean bowled Cameron Hemp. Mujeid Ilyas took his first competitive wicket for Abergavenny- 183-4 which became 192-2 when Owen Harris took his first wicket, in the next over Sam Clarke took his 4th wicket and finished with a very respectable 4-46. Whilst Abergavenny's Tom Norton was creating history in Sophia Gardens they had to entertain Newport without their talisman.

Newport won the toss and chose to bat on a used wicket, reaching 61 without loss after 10 overs. Few would have predicted that 26 overs later they would be all out for 154, adding only 93 more runs while losing all 10 wickets. Abergavenny's opening seamers were wicket less early on, but Jack Ryan and Owen Harris tightened the bowling

and sparked Newport's collapse. Jack Ryan who finished with 2-26 made the breakthrough when Imran was caught by Ryan Avery 66-1. Abergavenny CC Production line of talented Cricketers

From Avenue Road to the Record Books

Abergavenny Cricket Club has a proud tradition of developing talented cricketers from a young age. Across generations, players who began at Avenue Road have gone on to achieve notable success at county and professional level.

Earlier generations

One of the best-known names is Malcolm Nash, who entered the record books in 1968 when Sir Garfield Sobers hit him for six sixes. Nash began his cricketing journey at Avenue Road as a fifteen-year-old.

He was followed by Michael Powell, who went on to score 27 first-class centuries and earn an England A cap. Soon after came Mark Wallace, who became Glamorgan captain and is widely regarded as one of the county's finest wicketkeepers.

A new generation

In the 21st century, Ben Morris was awarded a contract with Glamorgan and made his List A debut in 2025. He has since been followed by Tom Norton and Eve Jackson, both of whom have also written their names into the record books.

Tom Norton became the youngest player to take a first-class hat-trick for Glamorgan, the youngest player anywhere to do so on first-class debut, and the first player of any age to achieve it on Championship debut since 1906.

Eve Jackson made her competitive debut for Glamorgan Women's new professional team in the Metro Bank One Day Cup against Sussex Sharks. Later, against Derbyshire Falcons, she entered the record books by bowling 35 consecutive dot balls, the second-best sequence on record behind Anam Amin's 37.

What unites them all is that their journey began at Abergavenny Cricket Club, where their talent was nurtured from a young age.

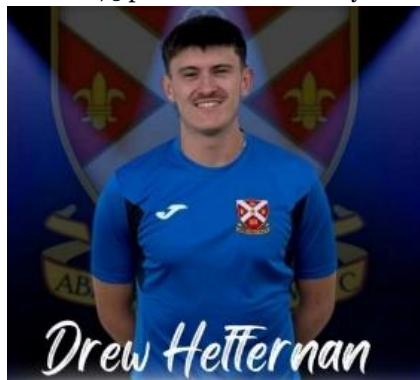

Christ College batted first and racked up an astonishing total of 321-0 with Jack Ryan scoring 214 not out from just 79 balls with 27 fours and 9 sixes, while his opening partner, Dylan Bradley, was unbeaten on 61. A shell-shocked Llandovery side were shot out for just 62 inside 13 overs.

Jack's momentous innings also places him top of the 'league' of century-makers since 1889, when the very first century (112) was scored by a Christ College XI batsman in a school match.

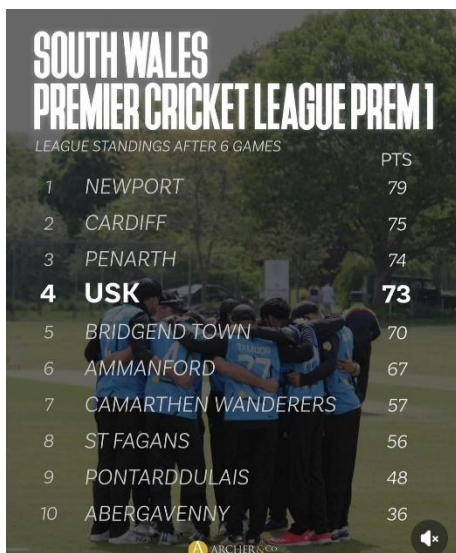

The siblings: Eve, 19; Tess, 17; Beth, 14; and Ted, 12.

School and early interest: All four attended Hay-on-Wye Primary School before moving on to Christ College Brecon. Eve left school last summer, while the other three remain at Christ College on sports scholarships. Their love of cricket began during lockdown in 2020, when fine weather encouraged the whole family—Mum, Dad, the three girls and six-year-old Ted—to find an outdoor activity they could enjoy together.

From driveway games to club cricket: The family played cricket on the driveway every day. As the children became more curious and wanted to learn properly, they began with plastic bats and balls and developed from there. When they outgrew the driveway and found no suitable local facilities, they cleared a disused, overgrown tennis court at an abandoned primary school, then built fences and nets around it to create a practice area. The family still maintains the site, and the children, including Eve, practise there almost every day. As lockdown ended, they joined Abergavenny CC, which had a strong junior section. Eve and Tess played in mixed Under-13 teams, while Beth and Ted joined the All-Stars programme. As their skills developed, they achieved national recognition representing Wales at different levels.

Where they are now: Eve now plays regularly in Tier 2 with Glamorgan CCC Women. Tess is part of the Glamorgan Under-18s, while Beth plays for the Glamorgan Under-14s; both are also members of the Glamorgan Elite Player Programme. Ted plays for the Glamorgan Under-13s, a year above his age group, and turns 13 in October.
